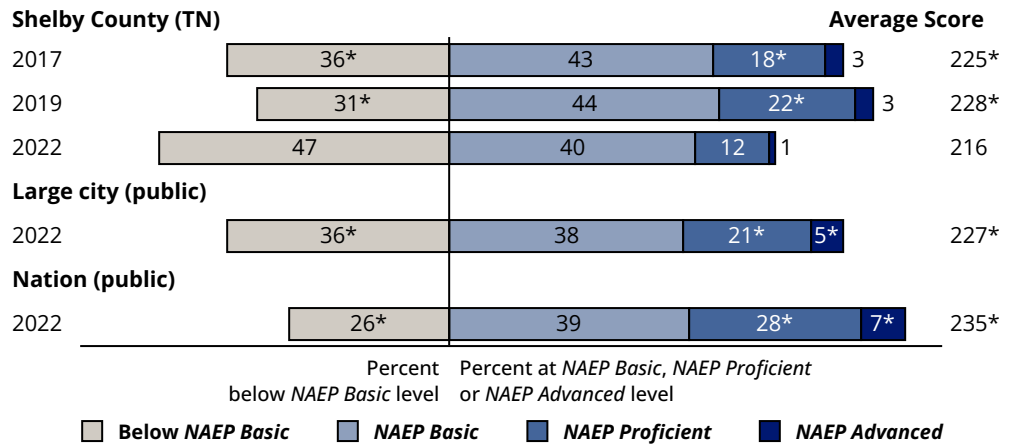


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Shelby County was 216. This was lower than the average score of 227 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Shelby County in 2022 (216) was lower than their average score in 2019 (228) and in 2017 (225).
- The percentage of students in Shelby County who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 13 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (25 percent) and in 2017 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in Shelby County who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 53 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (69 percent) and in 2017 (64 percent).

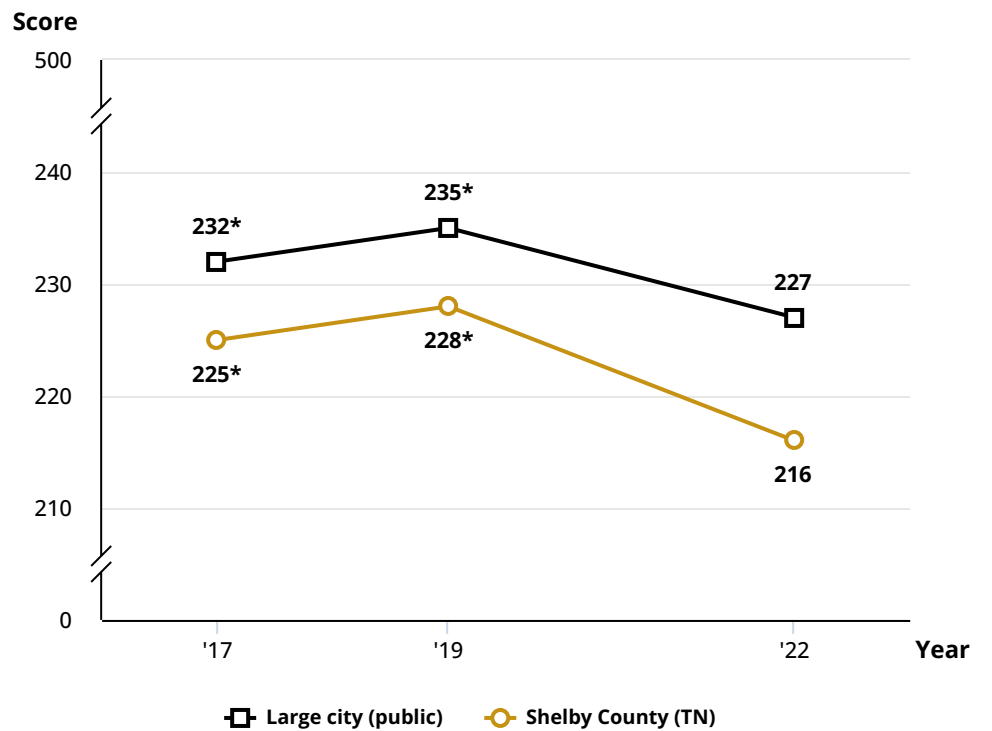

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for Black students.
- In 2022, male students in Shelby County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (16 points).
