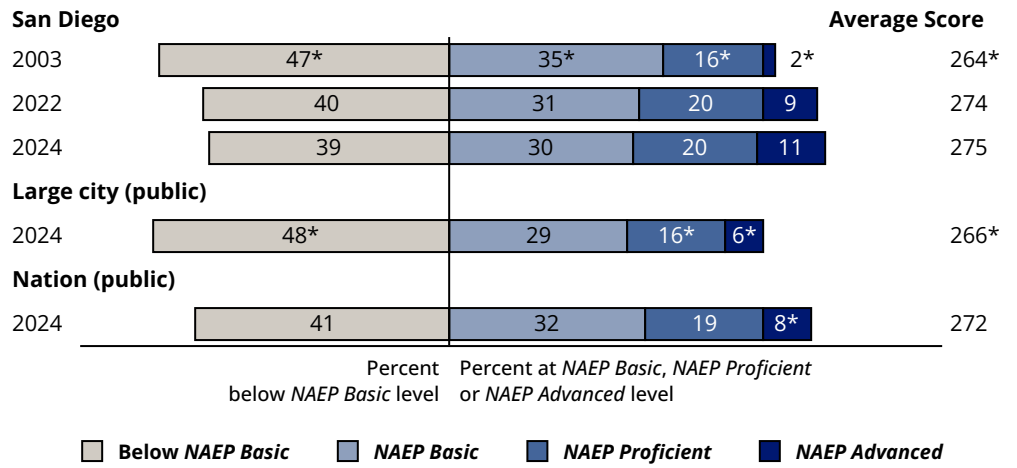


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in San Diego was 275. This was higher than the average score of 266 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in San Diego in 2024 (275) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (274) and was higher than their average score in 2003 (264).
- The percentage of students in San Diego who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 31 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (28 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (18 percent).
- The percentage of students in San Diego who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 61 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (60 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (53 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2024. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

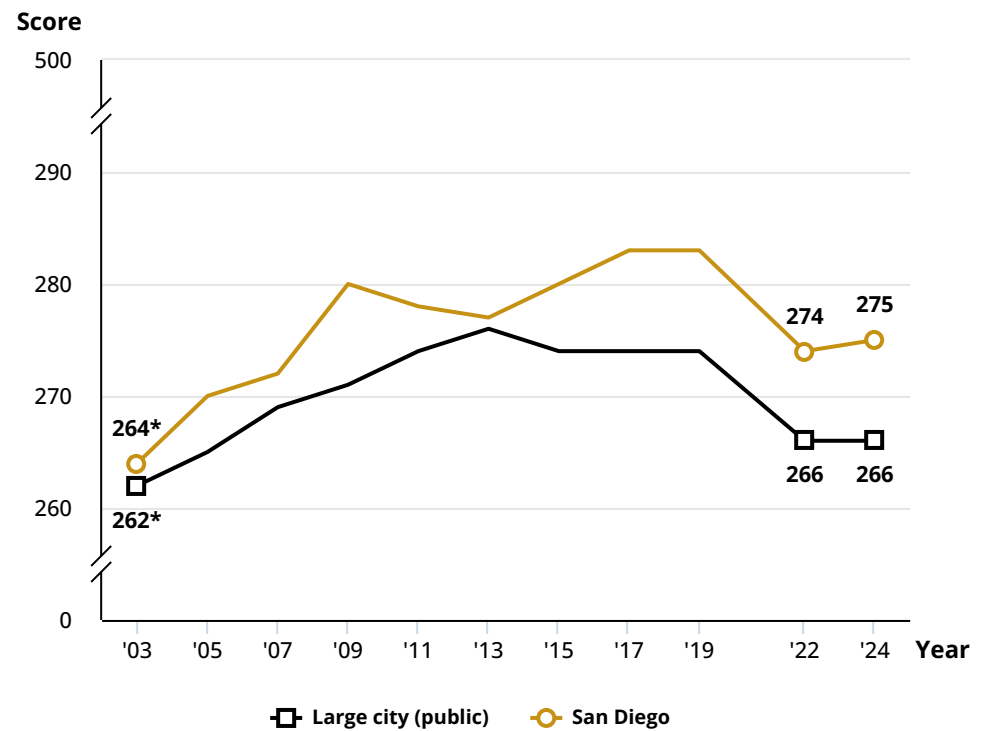

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2024, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (36 points).
- In 2024, male students in San Diego had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 7 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 42 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was wider than that in 2003 (26 points).
