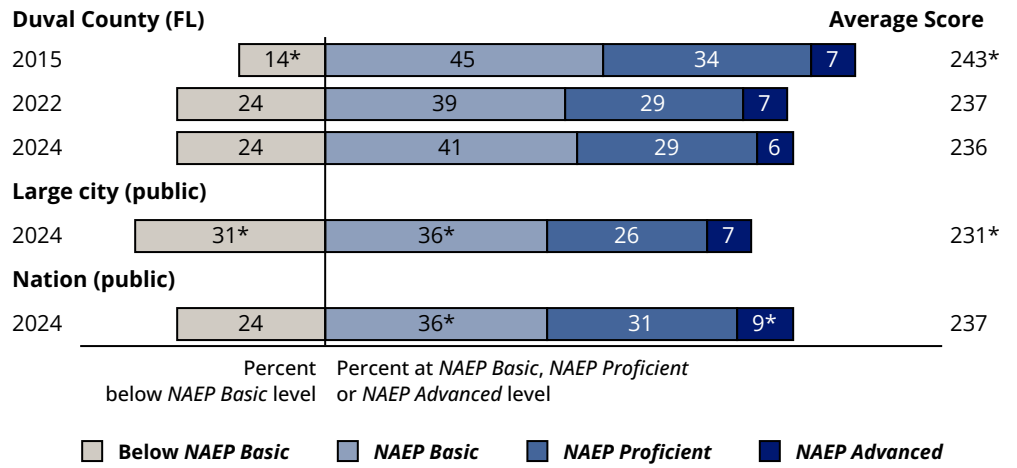


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Duval County was 236. This was higher than the average score of 231 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Duval County in 2024 (236) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (237) and was lower than their average score in 2015 (243).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (37 percent) and in 2015 (41 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 76 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (76 percent) and was smaller than that in 2015 (86 percent).

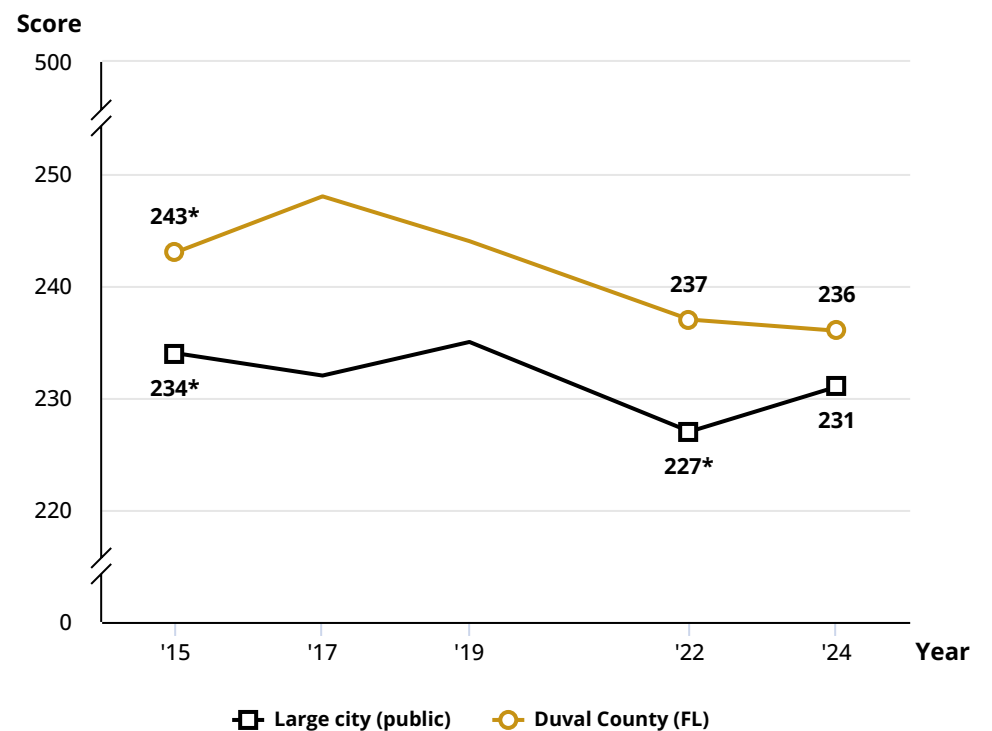

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (24 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 17 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (14 points).
- In 2024, male students in Duval County had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 6 points. This performance gap was wider than that in 2015 (3 points in favor of females).
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 14 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
