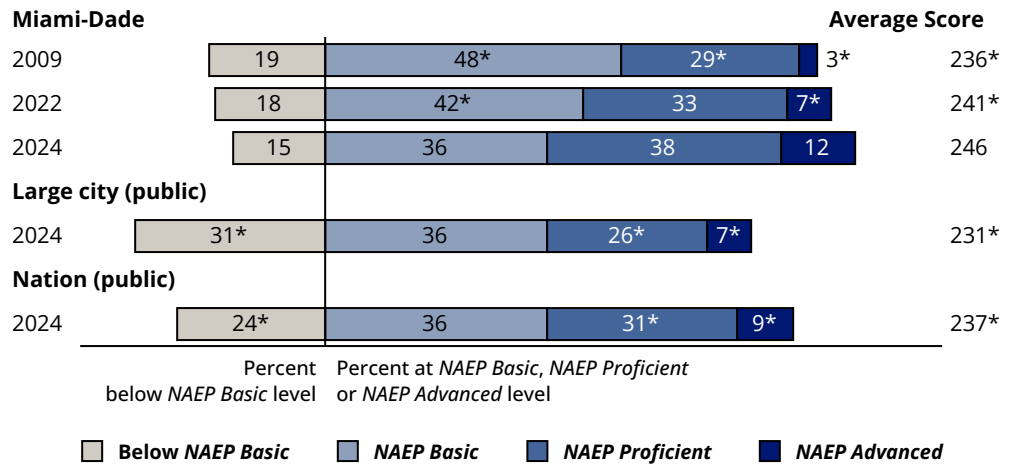


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Miami-Dade was 246. This was higher than the average score of 231 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Miami-Dade in 2024 (246) was higher than their average score in 2022 (241) and in 2009 (236).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 49 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than that in 2022 (40 percent) and in 2009 (33 percent).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 85 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (82 percent) and in 2009 (81 percent).

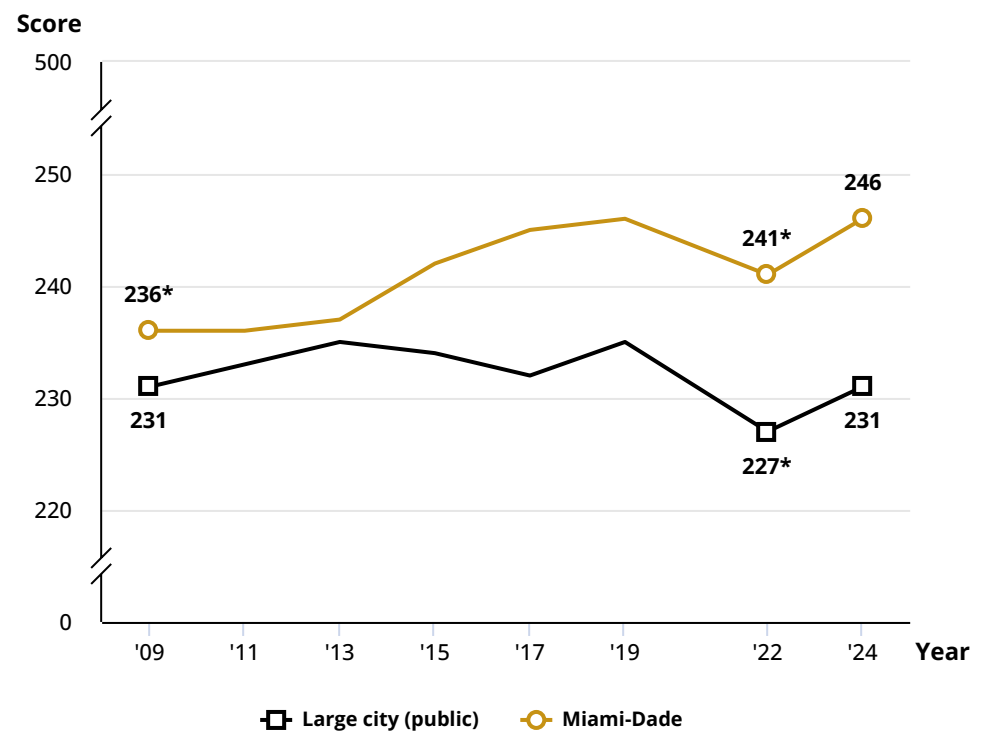

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (32 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 10 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 points).
- In 2024, male students in Miami-Dade had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 10 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2009 (19 points).
