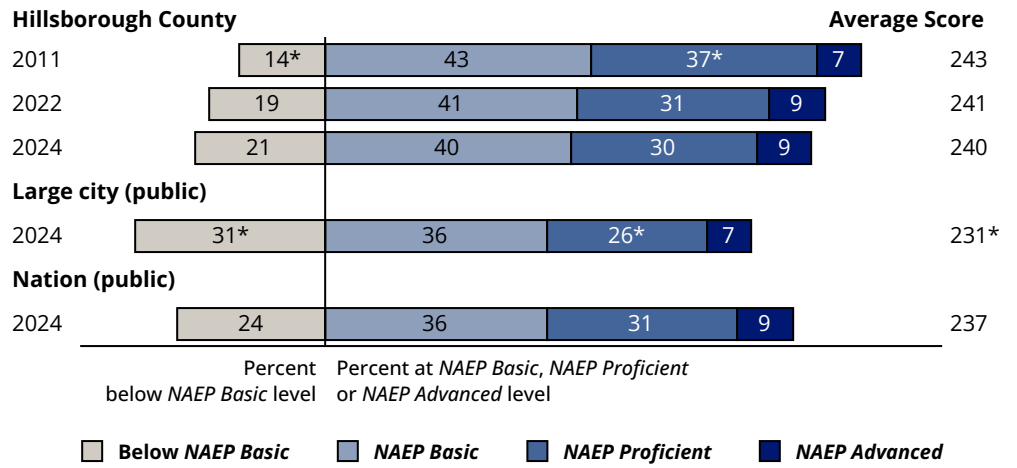


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Hillsborough County was 240. This was higher than the average score of 231 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Hillsborough County in 2024 (240) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (241) and in 2011 (243).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (40 percent) and in 2011 (43 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 79 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (81 percent) and was smaller than that in 2011 (86 percent).

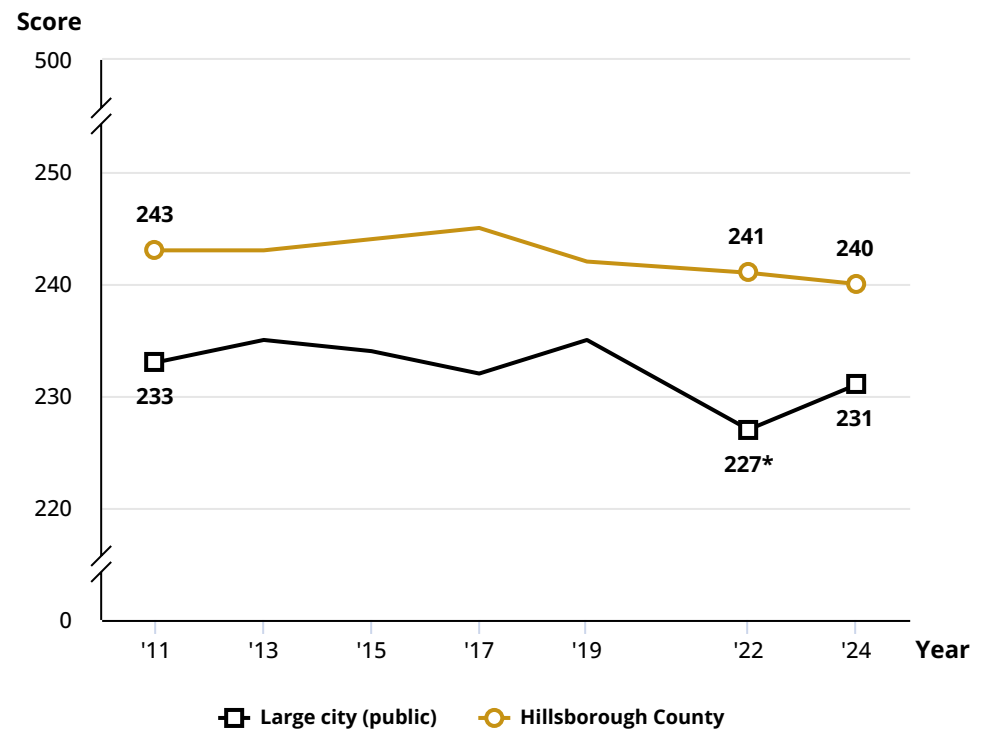

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (14 points).
- In 2024, male students in Hillsborough County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 points).
