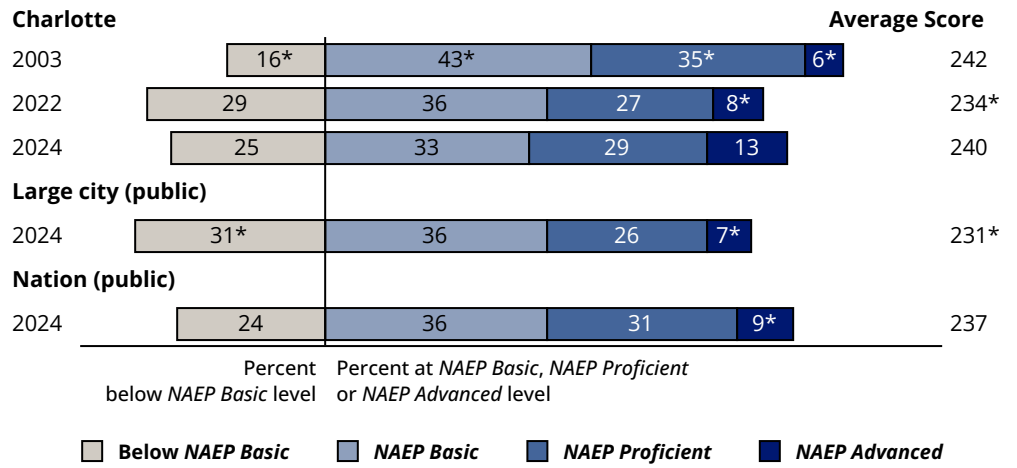


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Charlotte was 240. This was higher than the average score of 231 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Charlotte in 2024 (240) was higher than their average score in 2022 (234) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2003 (242).
- The percentage of students in Charlotte who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 43 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than that in 2022 (35 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2003 (41 percent).
- The percentage of students in Charlotte who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 75 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (71 percent) and was smaller than that in 2003 (84 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2024. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

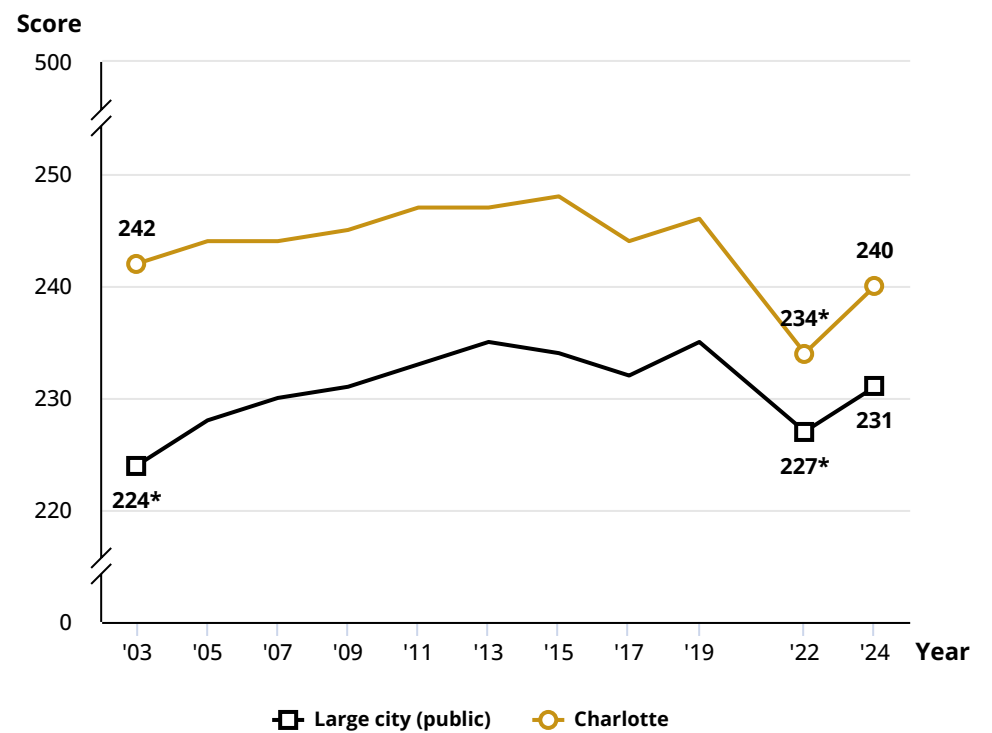

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2003 (28 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 41 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2003 (24 points).
- In 2024, male students in Charlotte had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (23 points).
