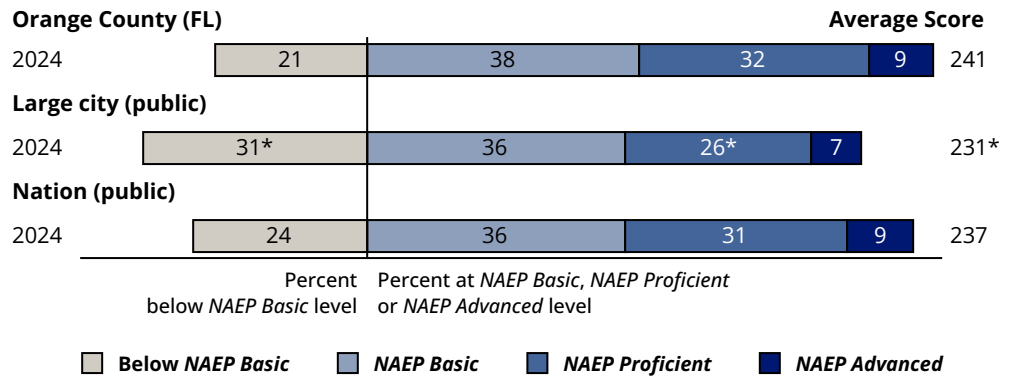


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Orange County was 241. This was higher than the average score of 231 for students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 42 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than large cities (33 percent).
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 79 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than large cities (69 percent).

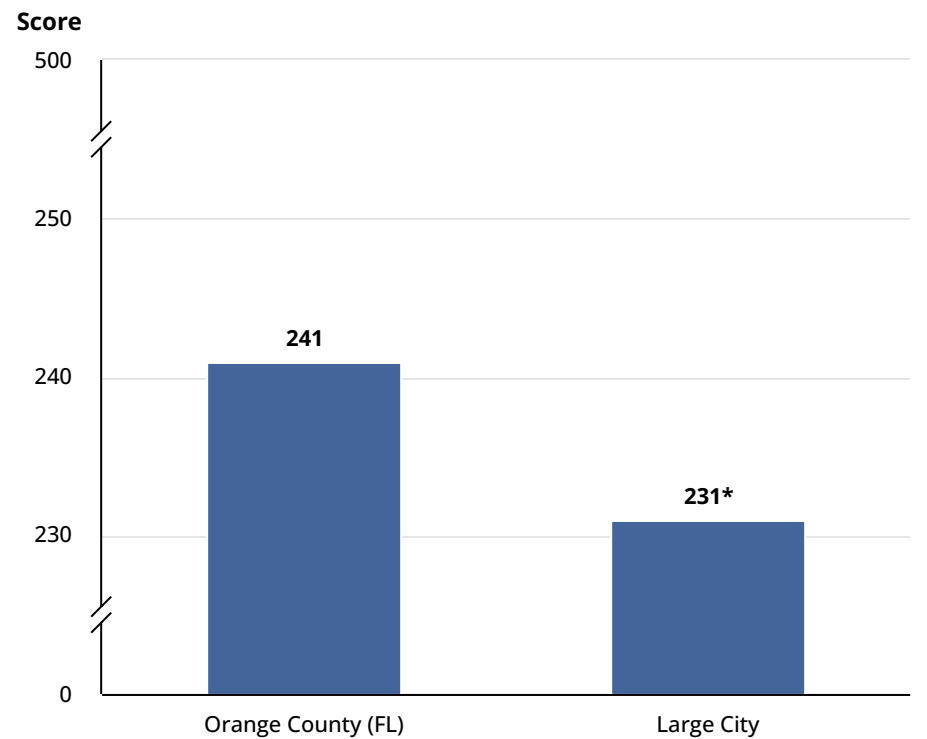

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (34 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (26 points).
- In 2024, male students in Orange County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 14 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (27 points).
