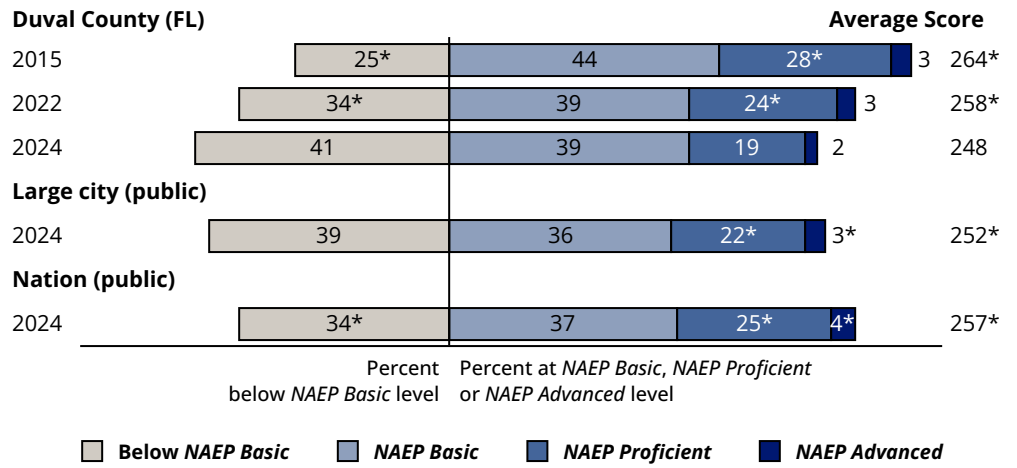


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Duval County was 248. This was lower than the average score of 252 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Duval County in 2024 (248) was lower than their average score in 2022 (258) and in 2015 (264).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 20 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (27 percent) and in 2015 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 59 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (66 percent) and in 2015 (75 percent).

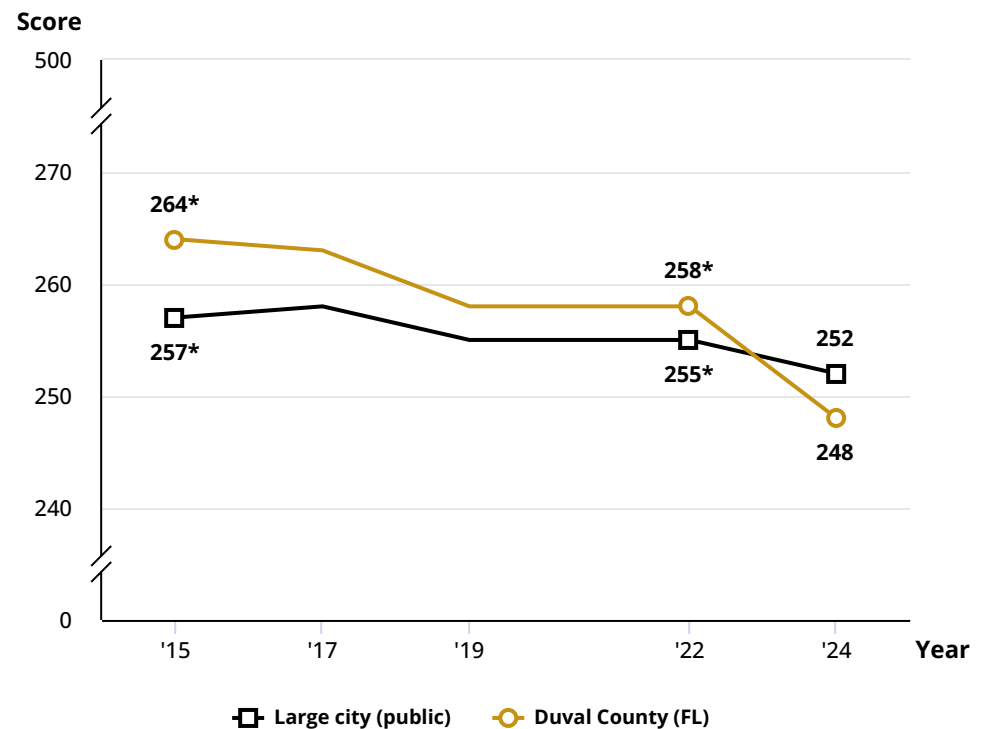

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2015 (10 points).
- In 2024, male students in Duval County had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 10 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (12 points).
