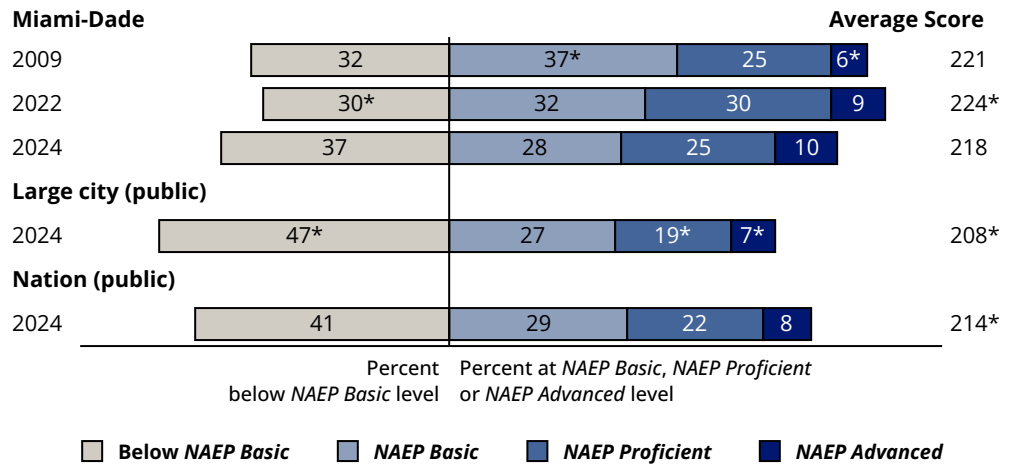


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Miami-Dade was 218. This was higher than the average score of 208 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Miami-Dade in 2024 (218) was lower than their average score in 2022 (224) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (221).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (39 percent) and in 2009 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 63 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (70 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2009 (68 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2024. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

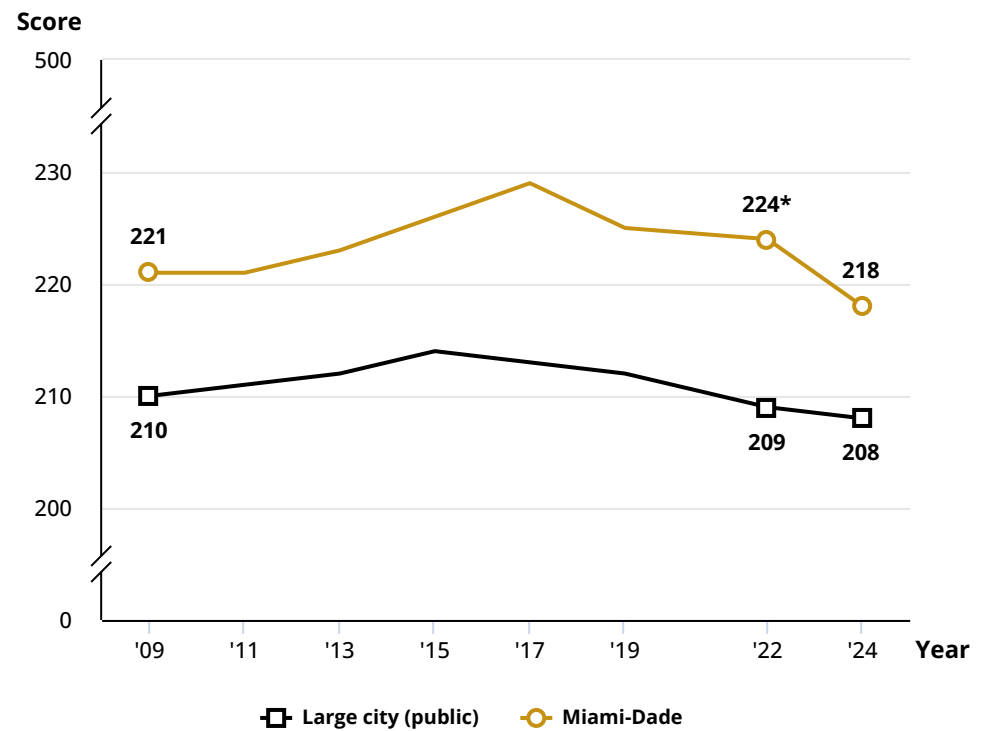

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (33 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (14 points).
- In 2024, male students in Miami-Dade had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 10 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 13 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (20 points).
