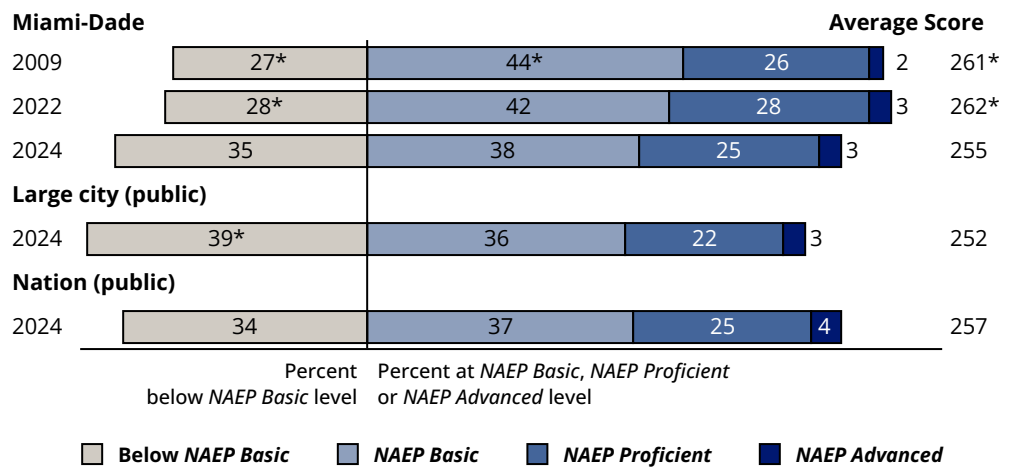


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Miami-Dade was 255. This was not significantly different from the average score of 252 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Miami-Dade in 2024 (255) was lower than their average score in 2022 (262) and in 2009 (261).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 28 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (31 percent) and in 2009 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Miami-Dade who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 65 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (72 percent) and in 2009 (73 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



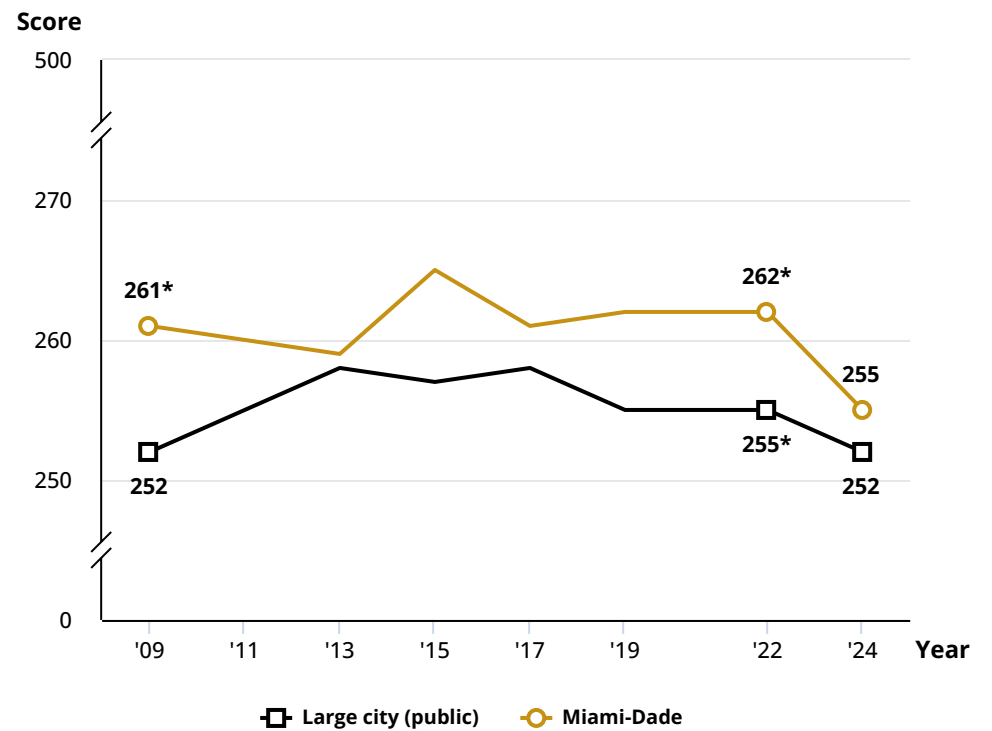

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (23 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for White students.
- In 2024, male students in Miami-Dade had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 7 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2009 (17 points).
