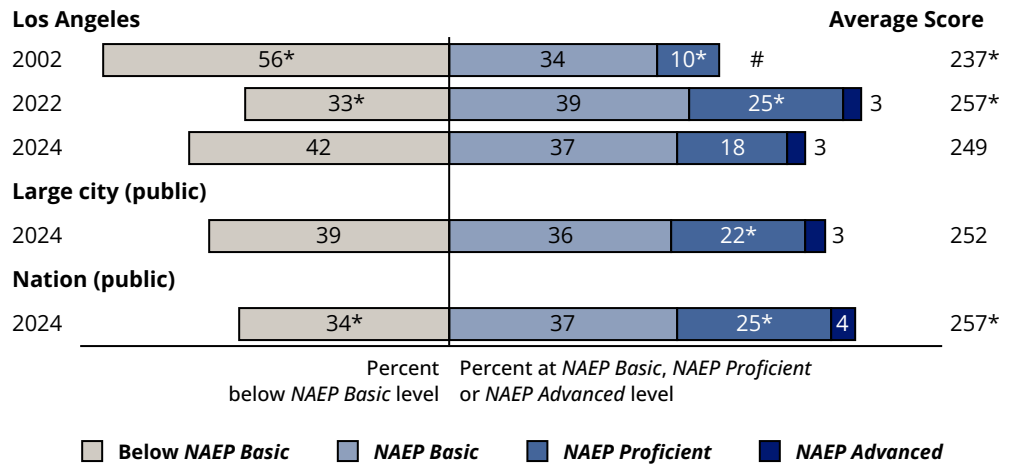


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Los Angeles was 249. This was not significantly different from the average score of 252 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Los Angeles in 2024 (249) was lower than their average score in 2022 (257) and was higher than their average score in 2002 (237).
- The percentage of students in Los Angeles who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 22 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (28 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (10 percent).
- The percentage of students in Los Angeles who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 58 percent in 2024. This percentage was smaller than that in 2022 (67 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (44 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



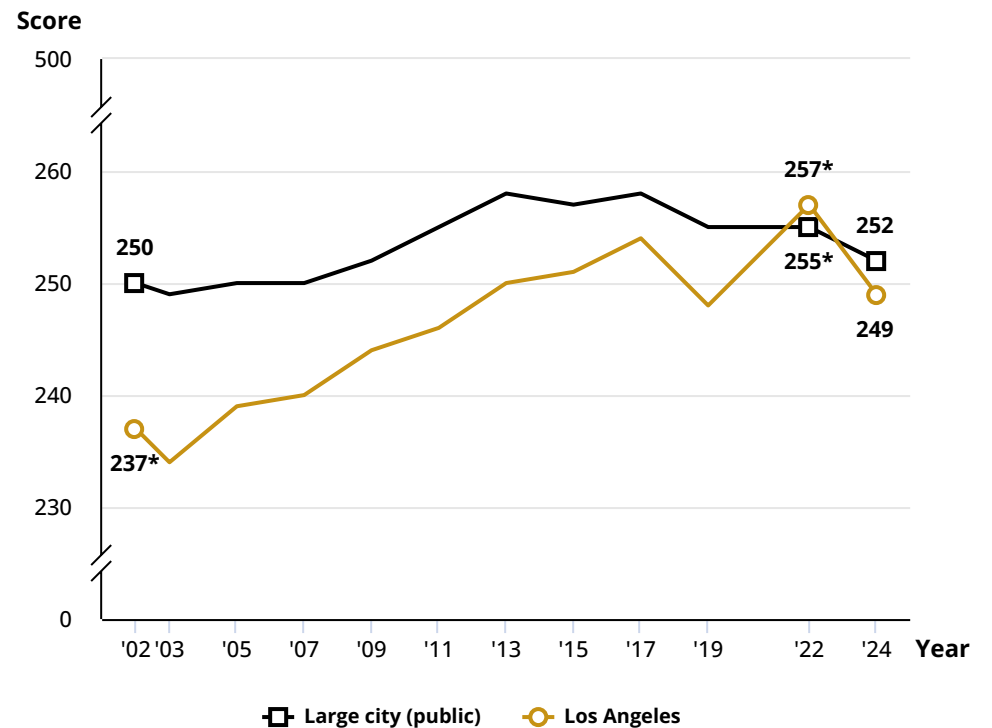

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (28 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (34 points).
- In 2024, male students in Los Angeles had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 8 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. Data are not reported for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged and economically disadvantaged in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
