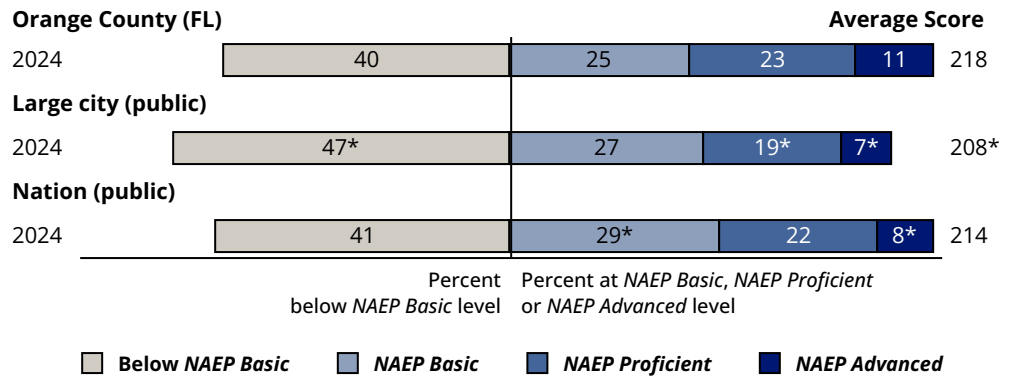


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Orange County was 218. This was higher than the average score of 208 for students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than large cities (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 60 percent in 2024. This percentage was greater than large cities (53 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



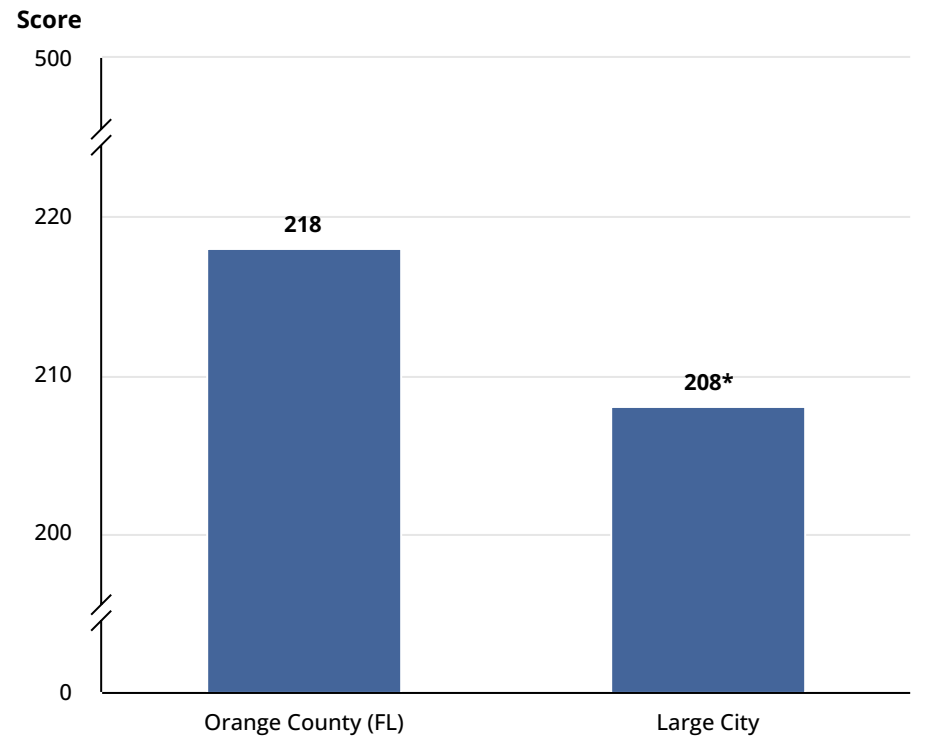

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 34 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (35 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (29 points).
- In 2024, male students in Orange County had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 12 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (30 points).
