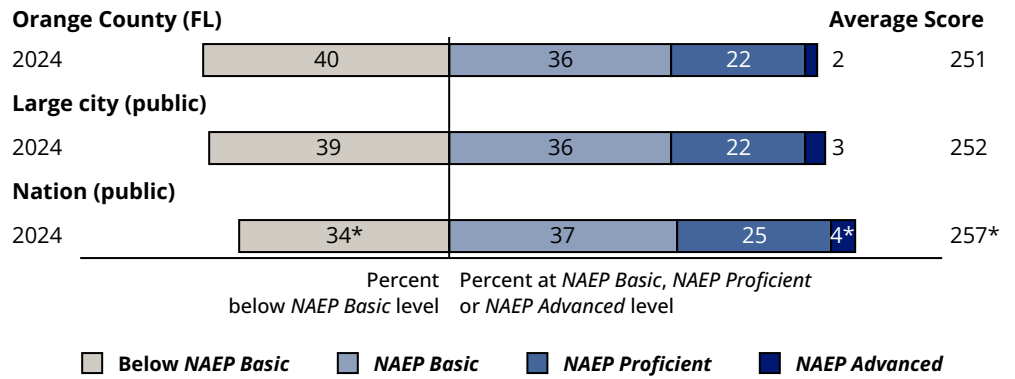


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Orange County was 251. This was not significantly different from the average score of 252 for students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 24 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from large cities (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Orange County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 60 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from large cities (61 percent).

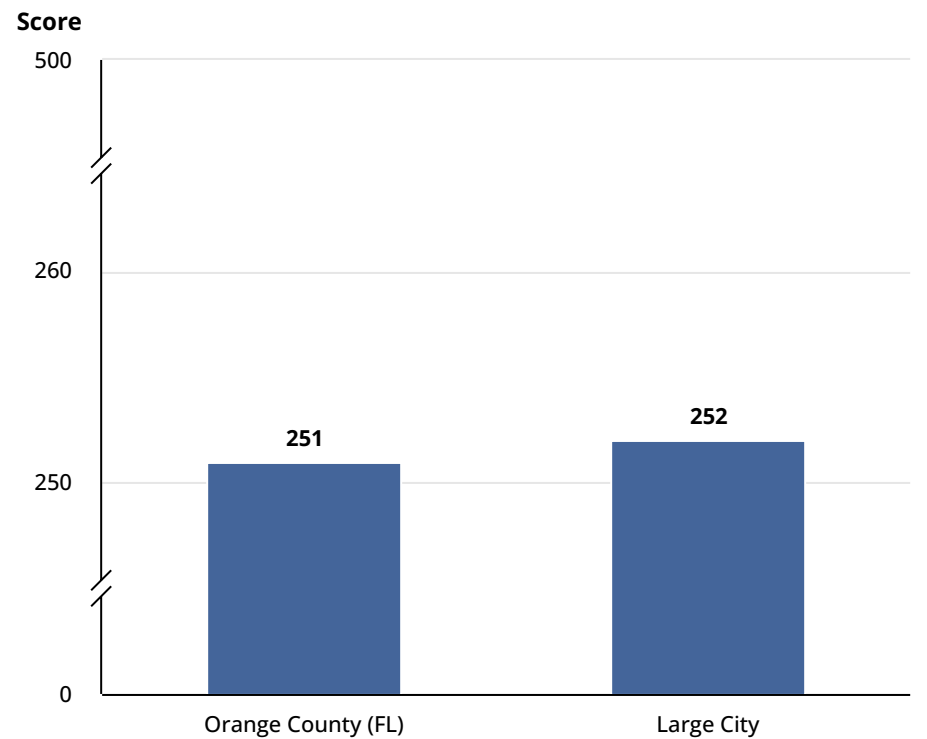

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (26 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 12 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (25 points).
- In 2024, male students in Orange County had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 8 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (24 points).
