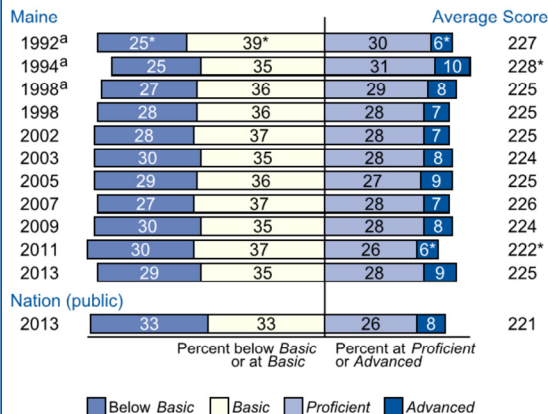


Overall Results

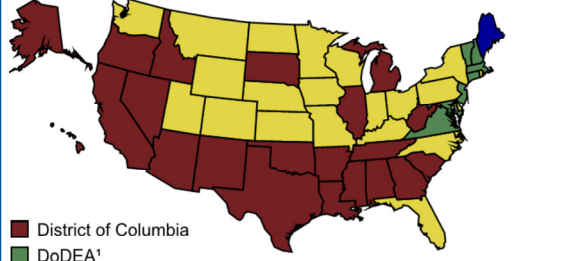
- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Maine was 225. This was higher than the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Maine in 2013 (225) was higher than their average score in 2011 (222) and was not significantly different from their average score in 1992 (227).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Maine (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 44 points in 2013. This performance gap was wider than that in 1992 (38 points).
- The percentage of students in Maine who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 37 percent in 2013. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (32 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1992 (36 percent).
- The percentage of students in Maine who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 71 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (70 percent) and was smaller than that in 1992 (75 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



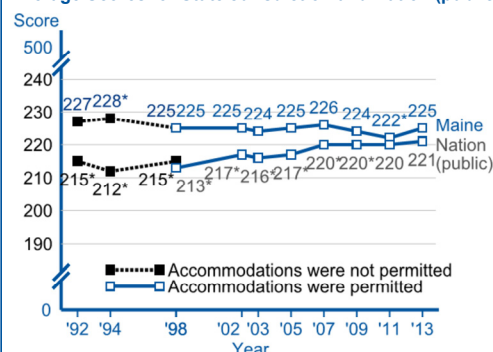

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 34 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2013, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2013, female students in Maine had an average score that was higher than male students by 7 points.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 20 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was wider than that in 1998 (15 points).
