


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Idaho was 284. This was higher than the average score of 281 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Idaho in 2015 (284) was lower than their average score in 2013 (286) and was higher than their average score in 2000 (277).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 34 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (36 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 75 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (78 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (70 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Idaho (284) was

- lower than those in 13 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 20 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 18 states/jurisdictions





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2015, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (30 points).
- In 2015, male students in Idaho had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (18 points).
