


Overall Results


- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in DoDEA was 166. This was higher than the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2015 (166) was higher than their average score in 2011 (161) and in 2009 (162).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 46 percent in 2015. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (40 percent) and in 2009 (40 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 84 percent in 2015. This percentage was greater than that in 2011 (77 percent) and in 2009 (78 percent).


Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in DoDEA (166) was

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (26 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 points).
- In 2015, male students in DoDEA had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 5 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible and eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2015, because reporting standards were not met.
