## Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Hawaii was 144. This was lower than the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Hawaii in 2015 (144) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (142) and was higher than their average score in 2009 (139).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 23 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 percent) and was greater than that in 2009 (17 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 58 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 ( 55 percent) and was greater than that in 2009 (50 percent).
