


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of fourth-grade students in Idaho was 156. This was higher than the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Idaho in 2015 (156) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (154).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (35 percent).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 81 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (79 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Idaho (156) was

- lower than those in 13 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 14 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 19 states/jurisdictions
- 5 states/jurisdictions did not participate in 2015





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2015, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 points).
- In 2015, male students in Idaho had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 points).
