


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Indiana was 156. This was higher than the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Indiana in 2015 (156) was higher than their average score in 2011 (153) and in 2009 (152).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (33 percent) and in 2009 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 70 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (67 percent) and in 2009 (67 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Indiana (156) was

- lighter blue: lower than those in 14 states/jurisdictions
- dark blue: higher than those in 17 states/jurisdictions
- grey: not significantly different from those in 15 states/jurisdictions
- white: 5 states/jurisdictions did not participate in 2015





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 37 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (33 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (24 points).
- In 2015, male students in Indiana had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 8 points.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (26 points).
