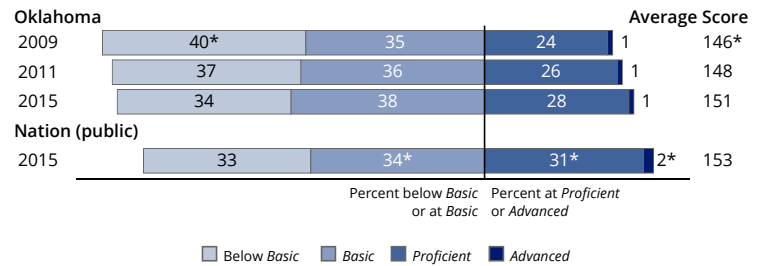


### Overall Results

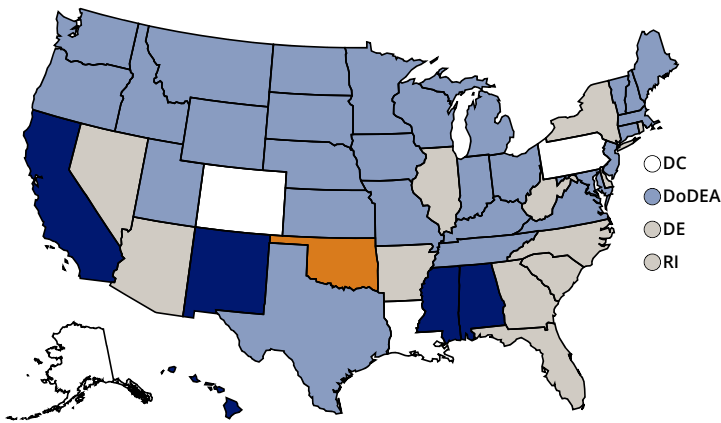
- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Oklahoma was 151. This was not significantly different from the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Oklahoma in 2015 (151) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (148) and was higher than their average score in 2009 (146).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 28 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 percent) and in 2009 (25 percent).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 66 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (63 percent) and was greater than that in 2009 (60 percent).

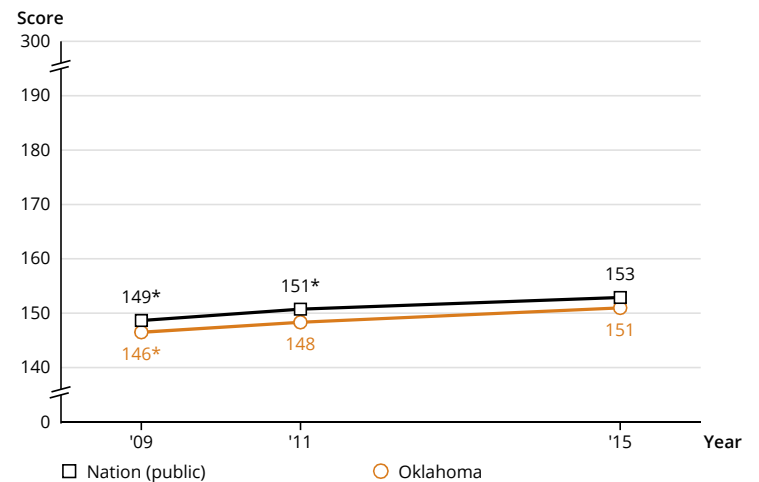
### Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



- In 2015, the average score in Oklahoma (151) was
  - lower than those in 29 states/jurisdictions
  - higher than those in 5 states/jurisdictions
  - not significantly different from those in 12 states/jurisdictions
- 5 states/jurisdictions did not participate in 2015

### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (28 points).
- In 2015, male students in Oklahoma had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 17 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (18 points).
