


Overall Results


- In 2015, the average score of fourth-grade students in Rhode Island was 152. This was not significantly different from the average score of 153 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Rhode Island in 2015 (152) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (150).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 76 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (74 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions




In 2015, the average score in Rhode Island (152) was

- lower than those in 22 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 7 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 17 states/jurisdictions

5 states/jurisdictions did not participate in 2015

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (34 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (37 points).
- In 2015, male students in Rhode Island had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 points).
