


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in DoDEA was 293. This was higher than the average score of 282 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2017 (293) was higher than their average score in 2015 (291) and in 2000 (277).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 42 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (40 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 83 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (83 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (68 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2017 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2017, the average score in DoDEA (293) was

- light blue: lower than those in 1 state/jurisdiction
- dark blue: higher than those in 47 states/jurisdictions
- white: not significantly different from those in 4 states/jurisdictions





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (27 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (19 points).
- In 2017, male students in DoDEA had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 4 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible and eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
