


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in DoDEA was 280. This was higher than the average score of 265 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2017 (280) was higher than their average score in 2015 (277) and in 1998 (269).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 51 percent in 2017. This percentage was greater than that in 2015 (47 percent) and in 1998 (37 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 91 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (90 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (79 percent).





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (22 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 7 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (7 points).
- In 2017, female students in DoDEA had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 11 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible and eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
