


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in Idaho was 270. This was higher than the average score of 265 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Idaho in 2017 (270) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (269) and was higher than their average score in 2002 (266).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (37 percent) and in 2002 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Idaho who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 81 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (81 percent) and in 2002 (79 percent).





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (21 points).
- In 2017, female students in Idaho had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2002 (14 points).
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (11 points).
