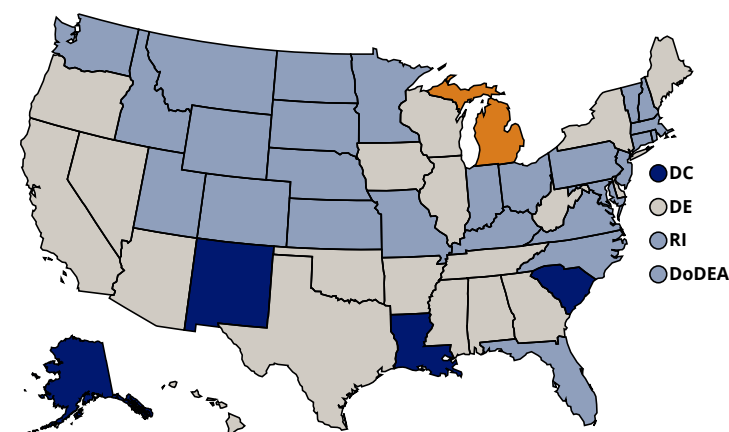


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Michigan was 218. This was lower than the average score of 221 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2017 (218) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (216) and in 1998 (216).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (29 percent) and in 1998 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 64 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (63 percent) and in 1998 (62 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2017 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2017, the average score in Michigan (218) was

- lower than those in 27 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 5 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 19 states/jurisdictions

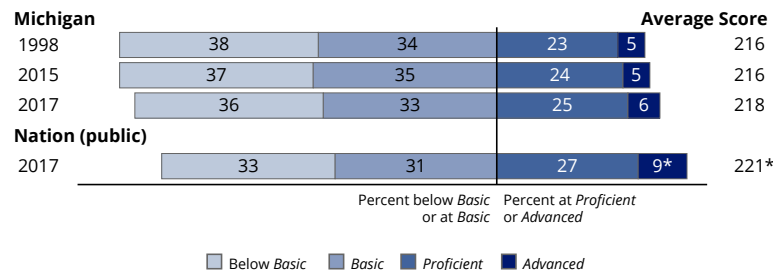

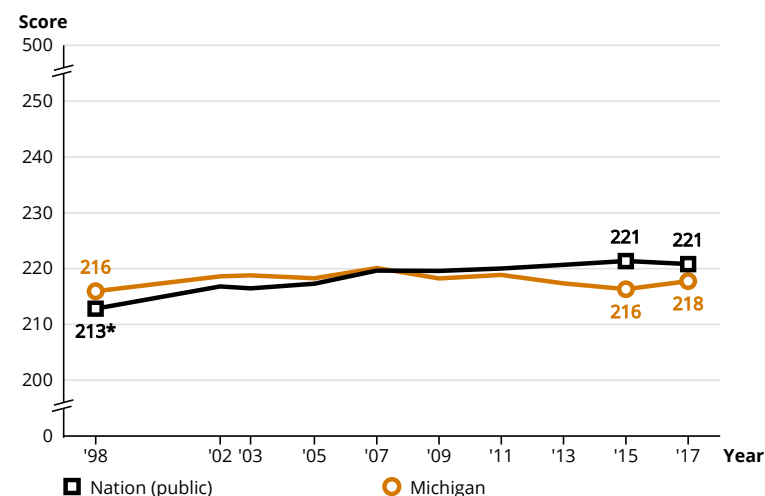

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (36 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (22 points).
- In 2017, female students in Michigan had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (24 points).
