


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Indiana was 245. This was higher than the average score of 240 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Indiana in 2019 (245) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (247) and was higher than their average score in 2000 (233).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 47 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (48 percent) and was higher than that in 2000 (30 percent).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 84 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (86 percent) and was higher than that in 2000 (77 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (25 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2000, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, male students in Indiana had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 5 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (20 points).
