


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in Nevada was 274. This was lower than the average score of 281 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Nevada in 2019 (274) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (275) and was higher than their average score in 2000 (265).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 26 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (27 percent) and was higher than that in 2000 (18 percent).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 62 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (62 percent) and was higher than that in 2000 (55 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2019, the average score in Nevada (274) was
■ lower than those in 38 states/jurisdictions
■ higher than those in 3 states/jurisdictions
■ not significantly different from those in 10 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 32 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (29 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (24 points).
- In 2019, male students in Nevada had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (26 points).
