


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Alaska was 204. This was lower than the average score of 219 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Alaska in 2019 (204) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (207) and was lower than their average score in 2003 (212).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 25 percent in 2019. This percentage was lower than that in 2017 (28 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2003 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Alaska who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 53 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (56 percent) and in 2003 (58 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions




In 2019, the average score in Alaska (204) was

- lower than those in 50 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 0 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 1 state/jurisdiction

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2019, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (17 points).
- In 2019, female students in Alaska had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 32 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (32 points).
