


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in DoDEA was 280. This was higher than the average score of 262 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2019 (280) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (280) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (269).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 52 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (51 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (37 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 91 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (91 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (79 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (22 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (7 points).
- In 2019, female students in DoDEA had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible and eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) in 2019, because reporting standards were not met.
