


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in Hawaii was 258. This was lower than the average score of 262 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Hawaii in 2019 (258) was lower than their average score in 2017 (261) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (249).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (30 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (19 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 68 percent in 2019. This percentage was lower than that in 2017 (72 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (59 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2019, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1998, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, female students in Hawaii had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 14 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (16 points).
