


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Oregon was 218. This was not significantly different from the average score of 219 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Oregon in 2019 (218) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (218) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (212).
- The percentage of students in Oregon who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 34 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (33 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Oregon who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 64 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (63 percent) and was higher than that in 1998 (58 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2019, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was narrower than that in 1998 (39 points).
- In 2019, female students in Oregon had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 5 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (30 points).
