


### Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Wisconsin was 220. This was not significantly different from the average score of 219 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Wisconsin in 2019 (220) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (220) and in 1998 (222).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (35 percent) and in 1998 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 66 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (66 percent) and in 1998 (69 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.


### Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2019, the average score in Wisconsin (220) was  
■ lower than those in 10 states/jurisdictions  
■ higher than those in 9 states/jurisdictions  
■ not significantly different from those in 32 states/jurisdictions

### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (41 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (27 points).
- In 2019, female students in Wisconsin had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (27 points).
