


Overall Results


- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in Wisconsin was 267. This was higher than the average score of 262 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Wisconsin in 2019 (267) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (269) and in 1998 (265).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (39 percent) and in 1998 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 76 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (79 percent) and in 1998 (78 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2019 to Other States/Jurisdictions




In 2019, the average score in Wisconsin (267) was

- lower than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 36 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 13 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (35 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (13 points).
- In 2019, female students in Wisconsin had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 14 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
