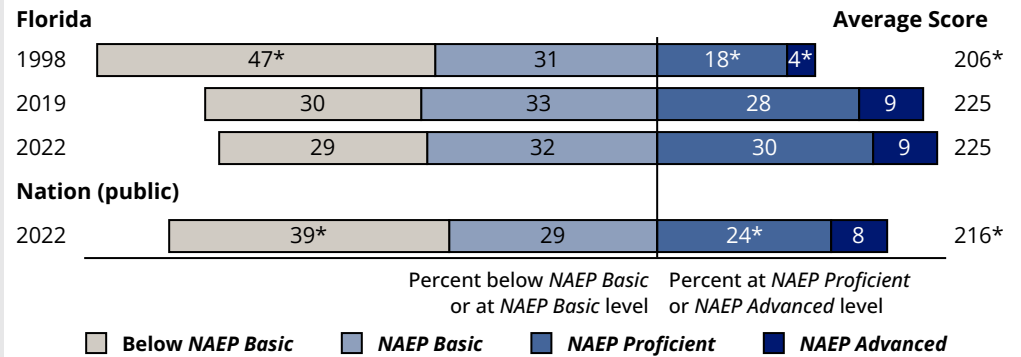


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Florida was 225. This was higher than the average score of 216 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Florida in 2022 (225) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (225) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (206).
- The percentage of students in Florida who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 39 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (38 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in Florida who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 71 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (70 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (53 percent).

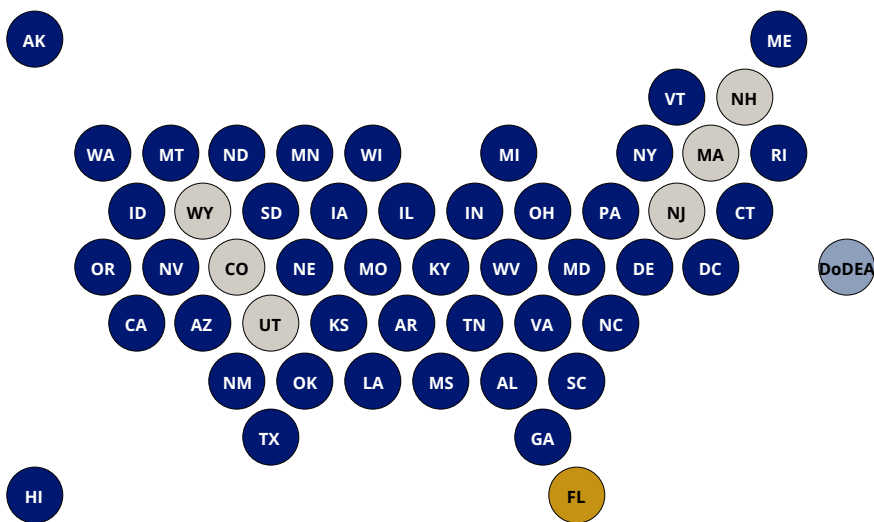
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

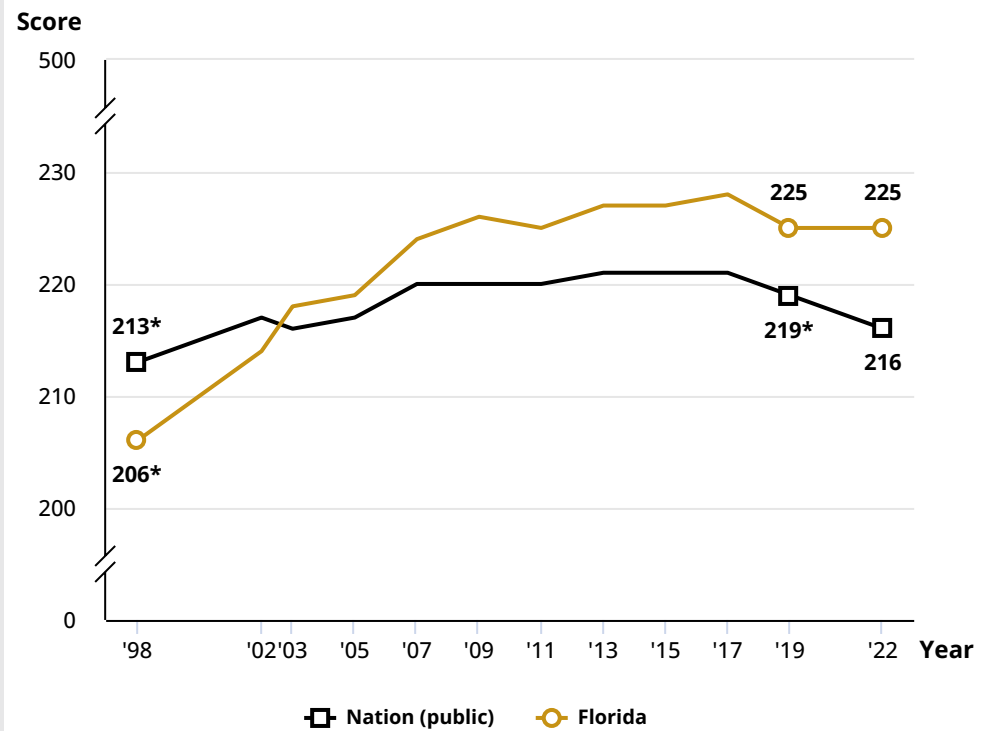
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (31 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 12 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
- In 2022, male students in Florida had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 7 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (29 points).
