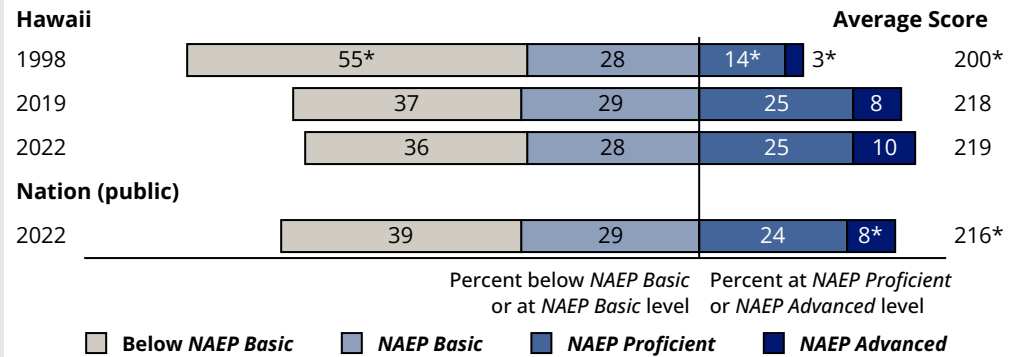


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Hawaii was 219. This was higher than the average score of 216 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Hawaii in 2022 (219) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (218) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (200).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (34 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (17 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hawaii who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 64 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (63 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (45 percent).

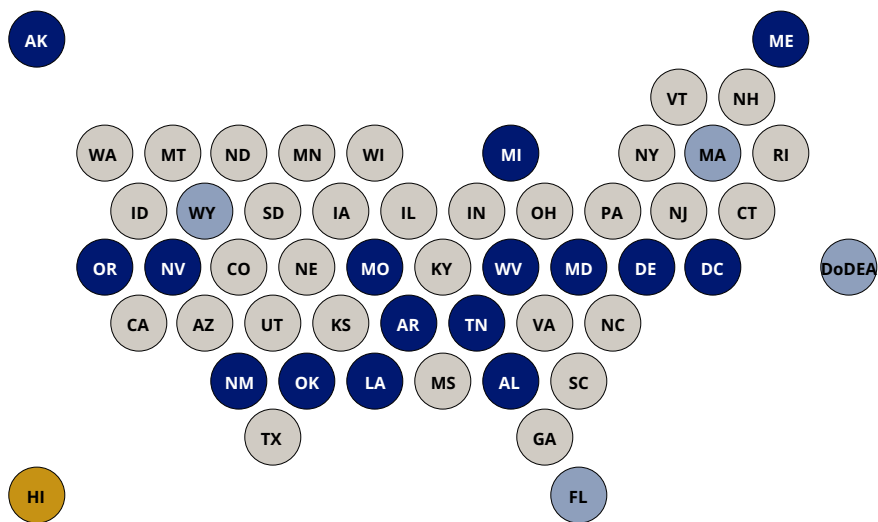
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

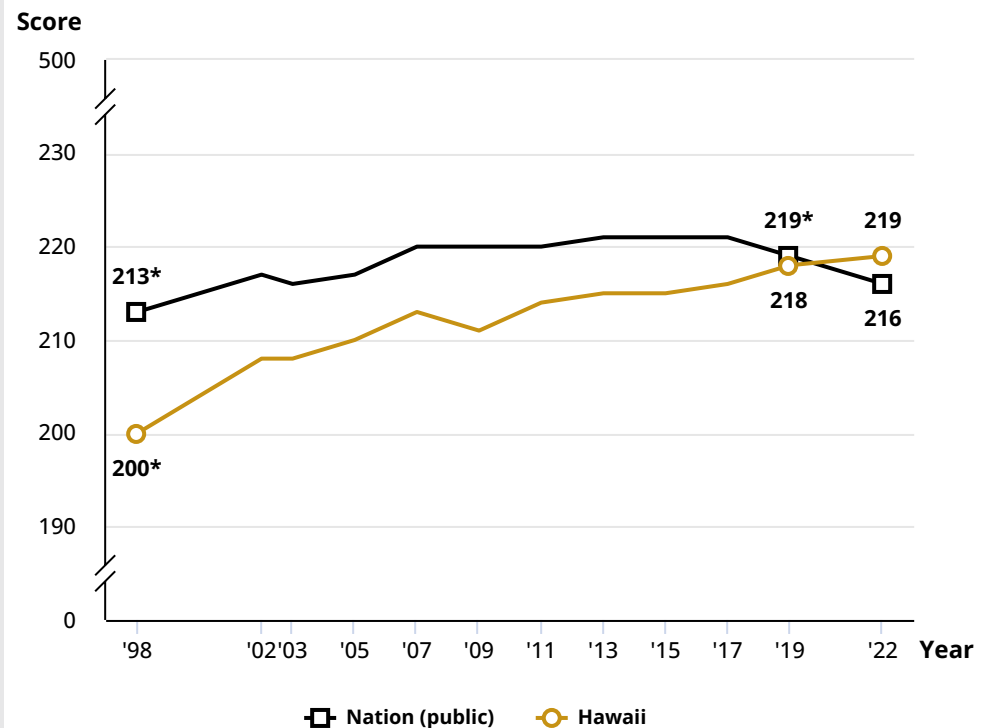
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 17 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (17 points).
- In 2022, male students in Hawaii had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 12 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (27 points).
