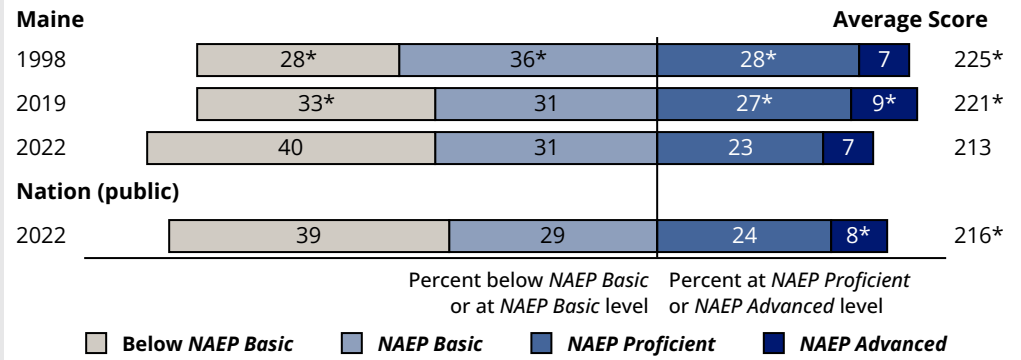


OVERALL RESULTS

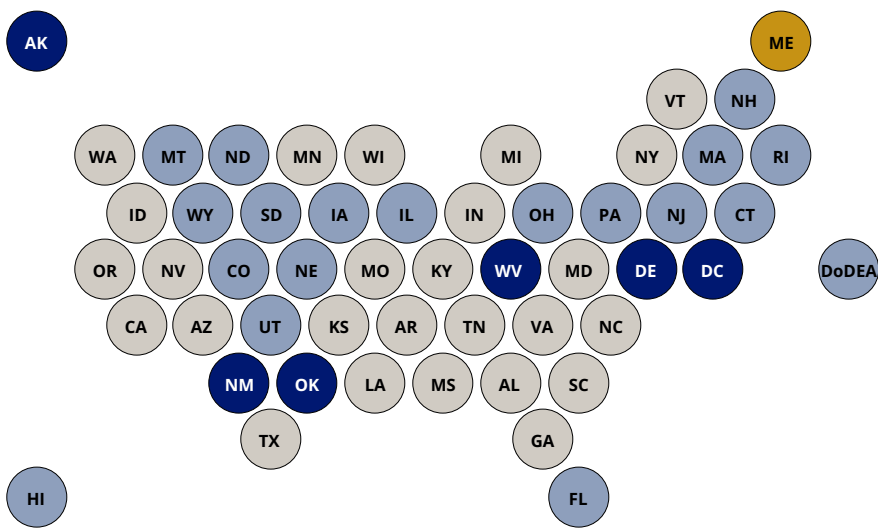
- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Maine was 213. This was lower than the average score of 216 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Maine in 2022 (213) was lower than their average score in 2019 (221) and in 1998 (225).
- The percentage of students in Maine who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (36 percent) and in 1998 (35 percent).
- The percentage of students in Maine who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 60 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (67 percent) and in 1998 (72 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

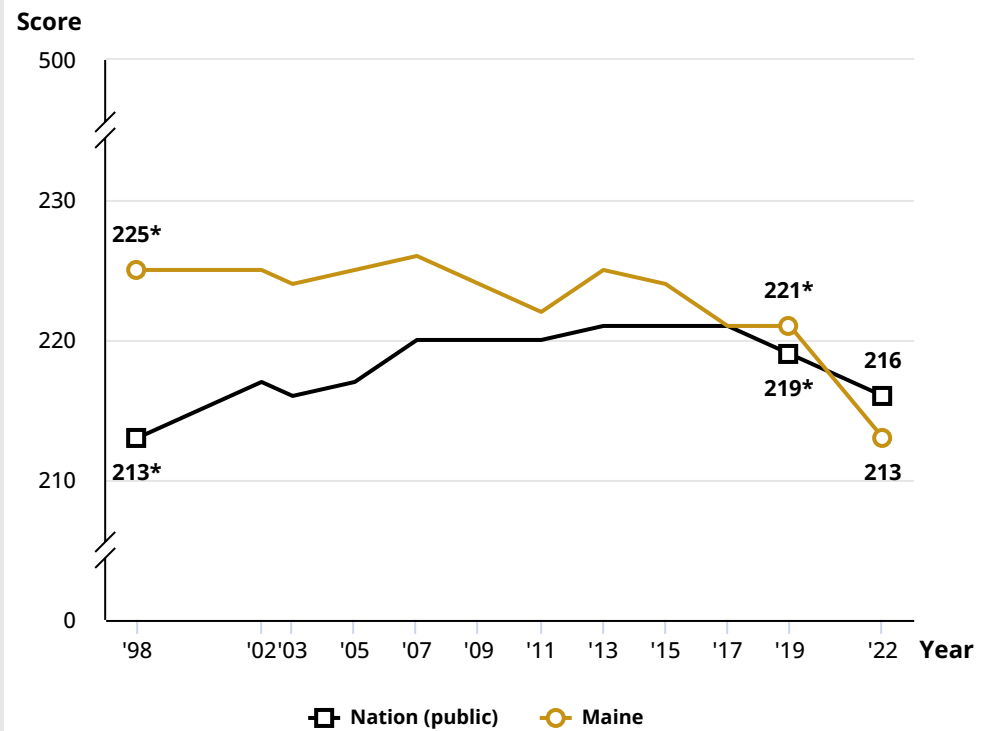
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 1998, because reporting standards were not met.
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in Maine had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 1998 (15 points).
