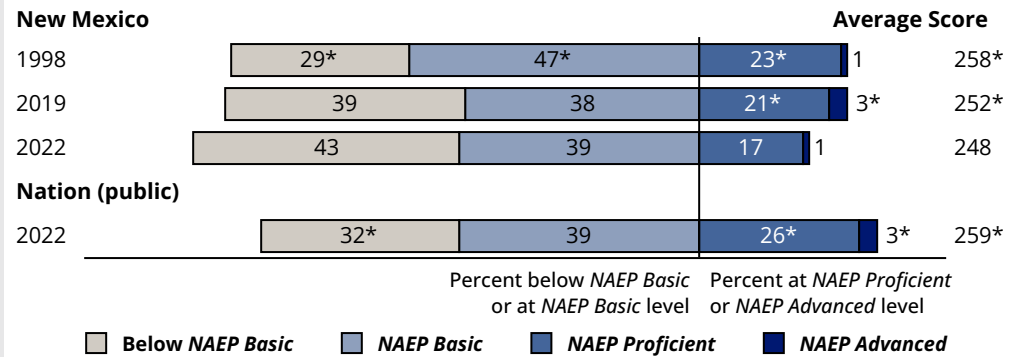


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in New Mexico was 248. This was lower than the average score of 259 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Mexico in 2022 (248) was lower than their average score in 2019 (252) and in 1998 (258).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 18 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (23 percent) and in 1998 (23 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 57 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (61 percent) and was smaller than that in 1998 (71 percent).

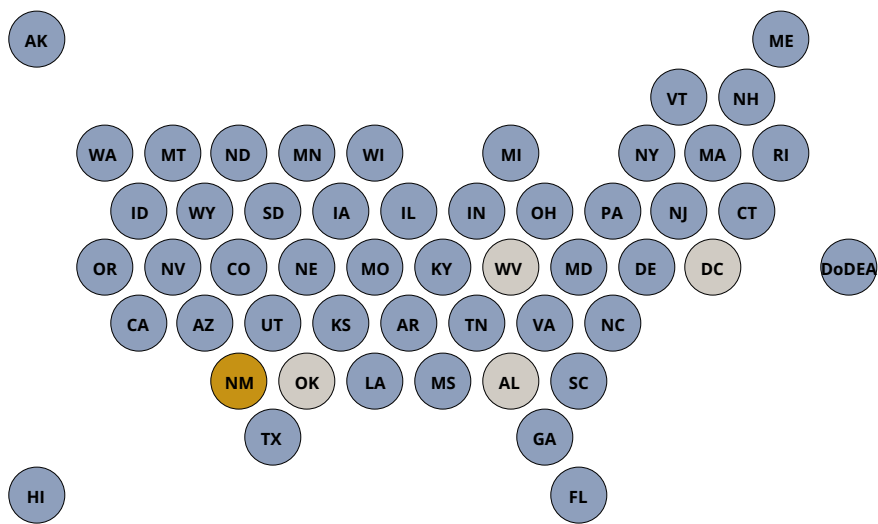
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

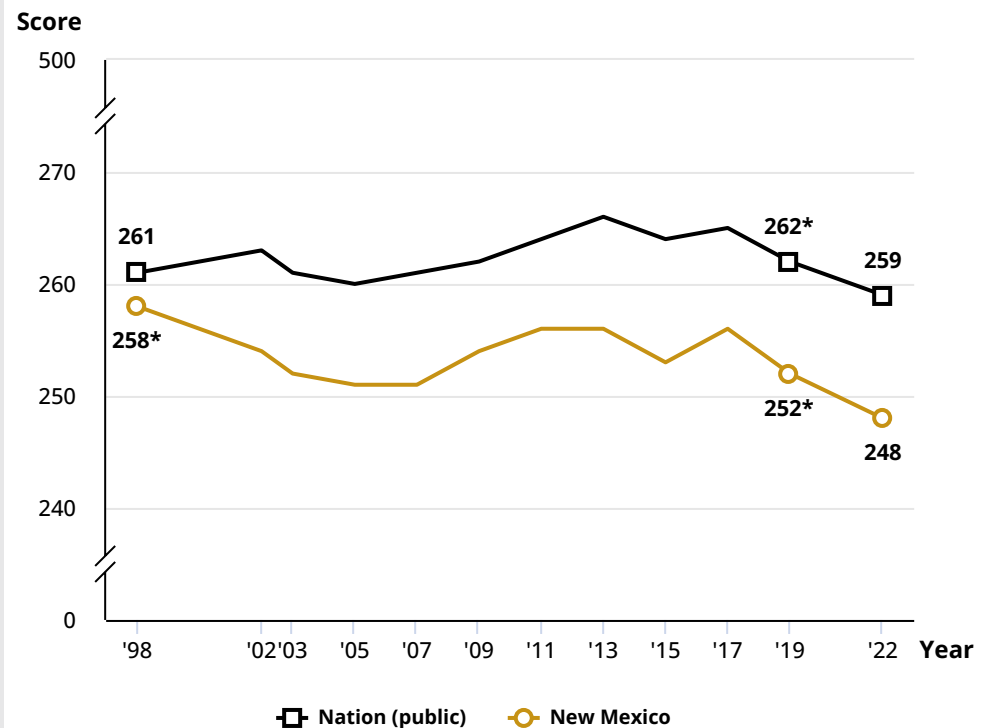
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
- In 2022, male students in New Mexico had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 11 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 1998 (15 points).
