
OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Vermont was 217. This was not significantly different from the average score of 216 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Vermont in 2022 (217) was lower than their average score in 2019 (222) and in 2002 (227).
- The percentage of students in Vermont who performed at or above the NAEP
 Proficient level was 34 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019
 (37 percent) and in 2002 (39 percent).
- The percentage of students in Vermont who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 62 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (68 percent) and in 2002 (73 percent).


NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in Vermont had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP)
 had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were not
 eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (20
 points).



NOTE: The NAEP reading scale ranges from 0 to 500. Results presented in this report are based on public school students only. Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages. Score gap results for "White," "Black," and "Hispanic" presented in this report are based on the 6-category race/ethnicity variable with data available starting in early 1990s.
