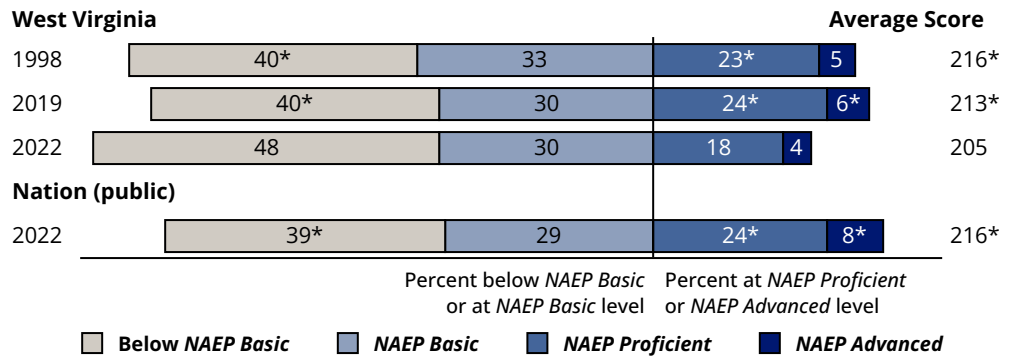


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in West Virginia was 205. This was lower than the average score of 216 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in West Virginia in 2022 (205) was lower than their average score in 2019 (213) and in 1998 (216).
- The percentage of students in West Virginia who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 22 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (30 percent) and in 1998 (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in West Virginia who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 52 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (60 percent) and in 1998 (60 percent).

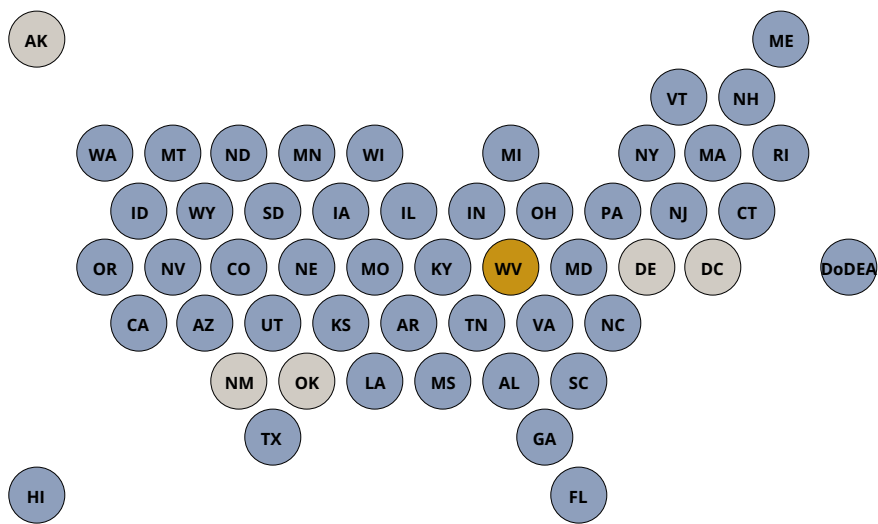
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

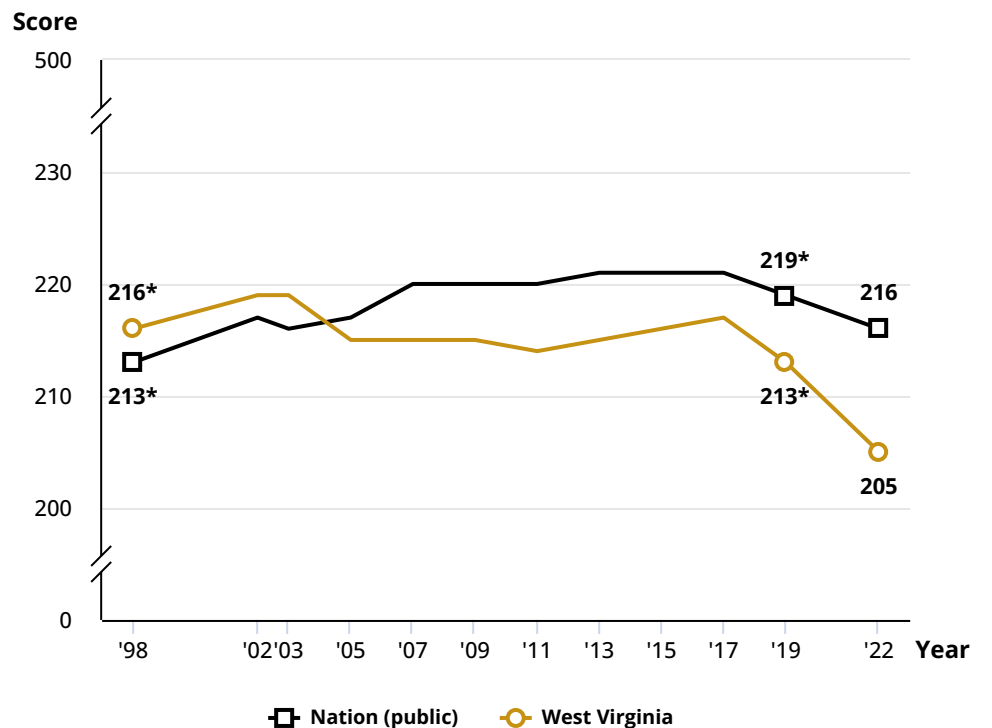


In 2022, the average score in West Virginia (205) was

- lower than those in 46 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 0 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 5 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for White students.
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in West Virginia had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (21 points).
