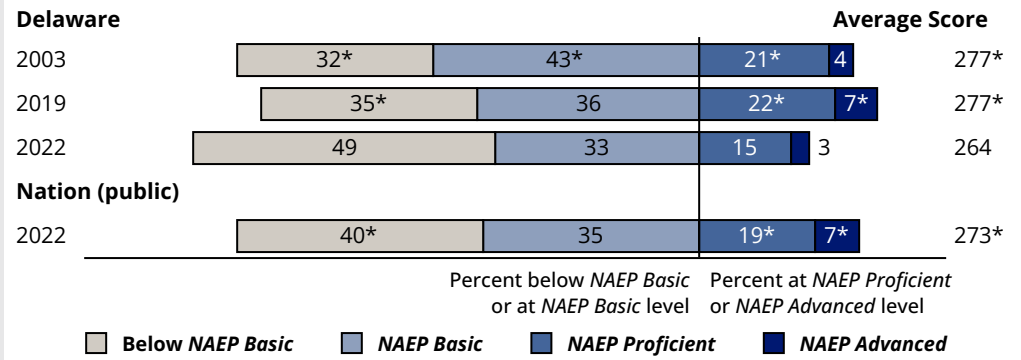


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Delaware was 264. This was lower than the average score of 273 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Delaware in 2022 (264) was lower than their average score in 2019 (277) and in 2003 (277).
- The percentage of students in Delaware who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 18 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (29 percent) and in 2003 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Delaware who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 51 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (65 percent) and in 2003 (68 percent).

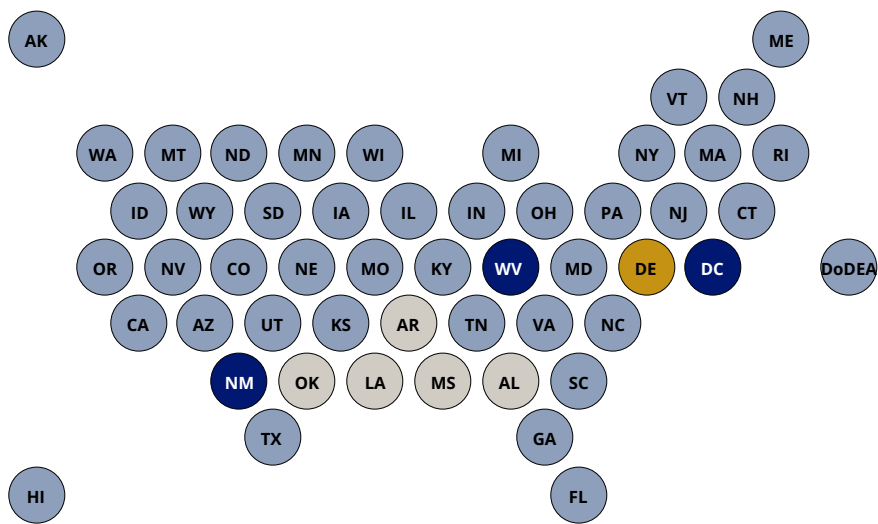
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

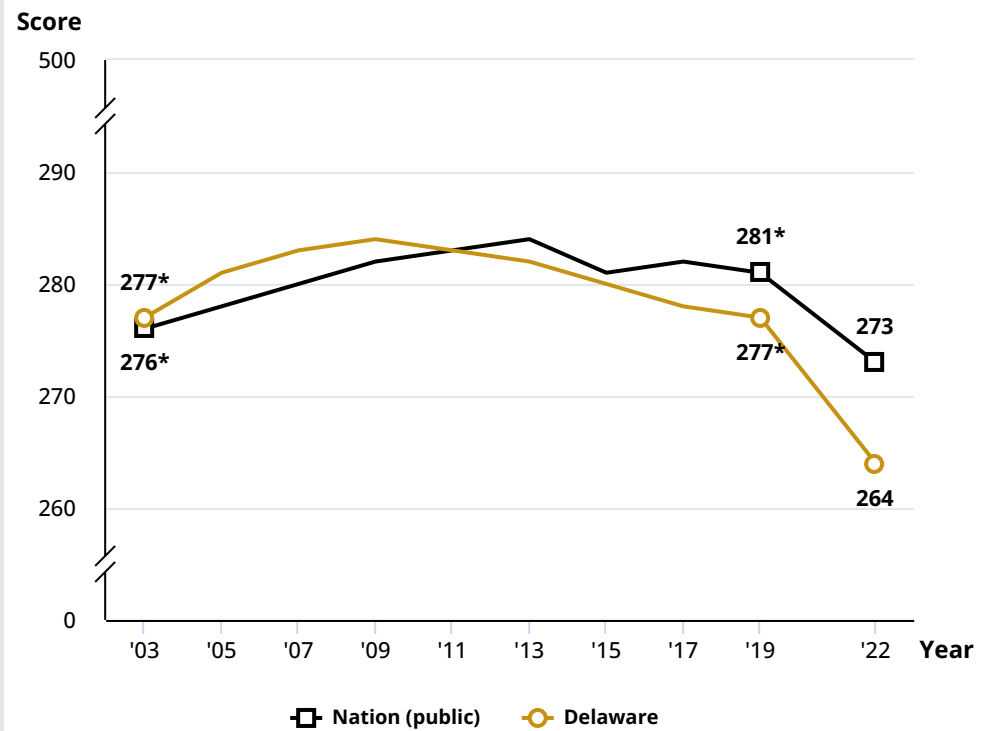


In 2022, the average score in Delaware (264) was

- lower than those in 43 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 3 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 5 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 34 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2003 (26 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (30 points).
- In 2022, male students in Delaware had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (24 points).
