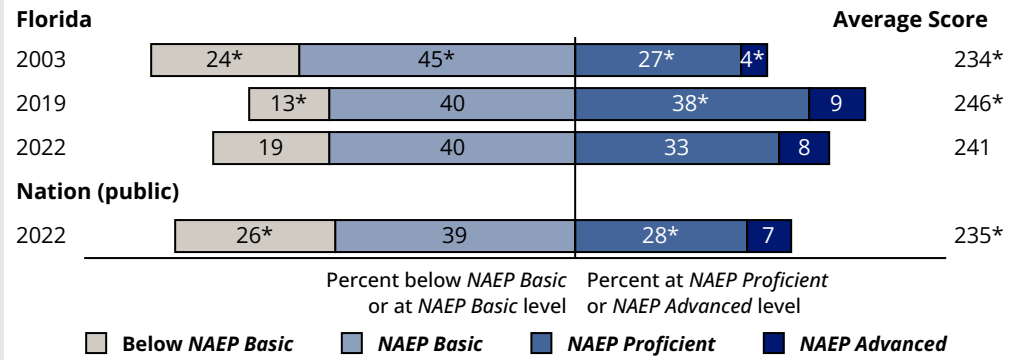


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Florida was 241. This was higher than the average score of 235 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Florida in 2022 (241) was lower than their average score in 2019 (246) and was higher than their average score in 2003 (234).
- The percentage of students in Florida who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 41 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (48 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Florida who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 81 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (87 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (76 percent).

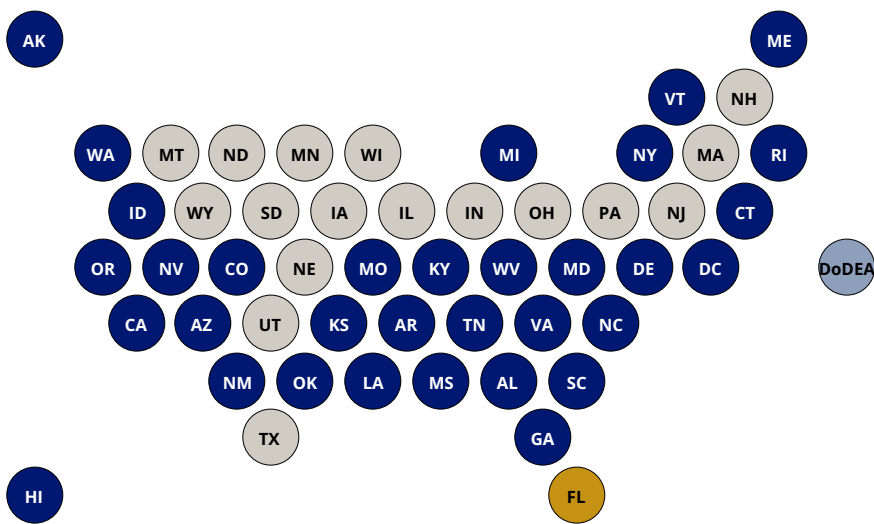
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

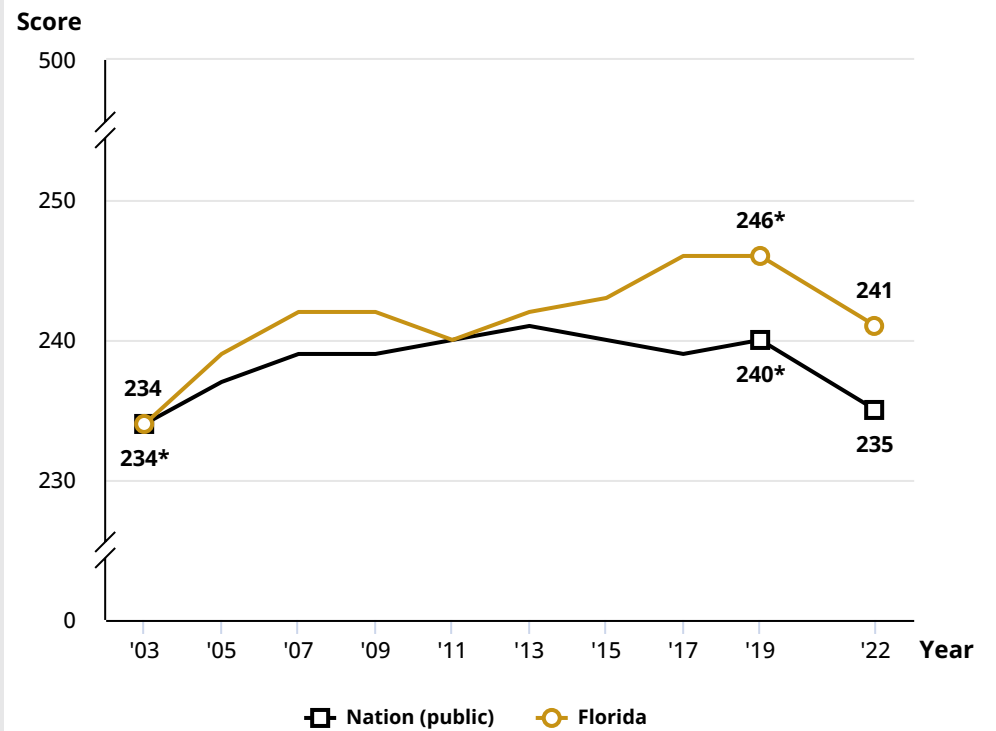
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2022 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (28 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 17 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2003 (11 points).
- In 2022, male students in Florida had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2003 (23 points).
