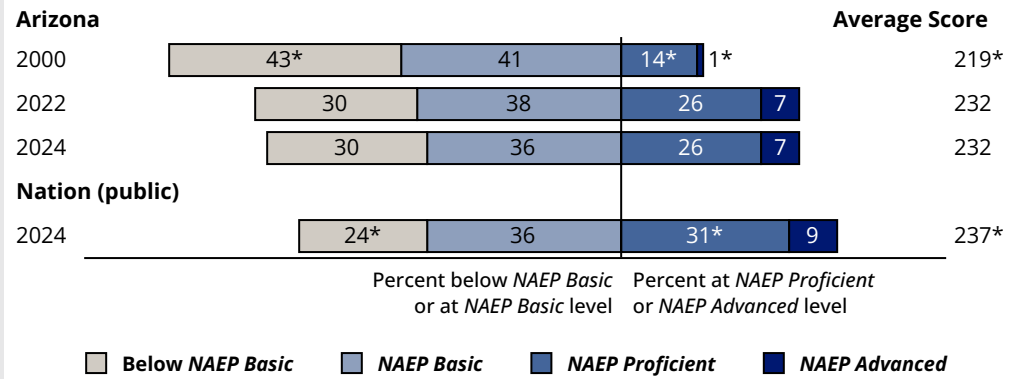


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Arizona was 232. This was lower than the average score of 237 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Arizona in 2024 (232) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (232) and was higher than their average score in 2000 (219).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 34 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (32 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (16 percent).
- The percentage of students in Arizona who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 70 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (70 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (57 percent).

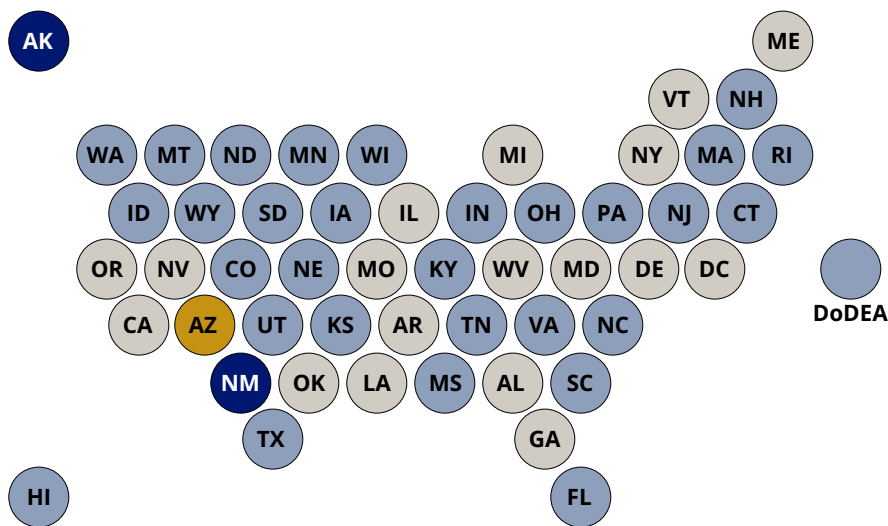
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

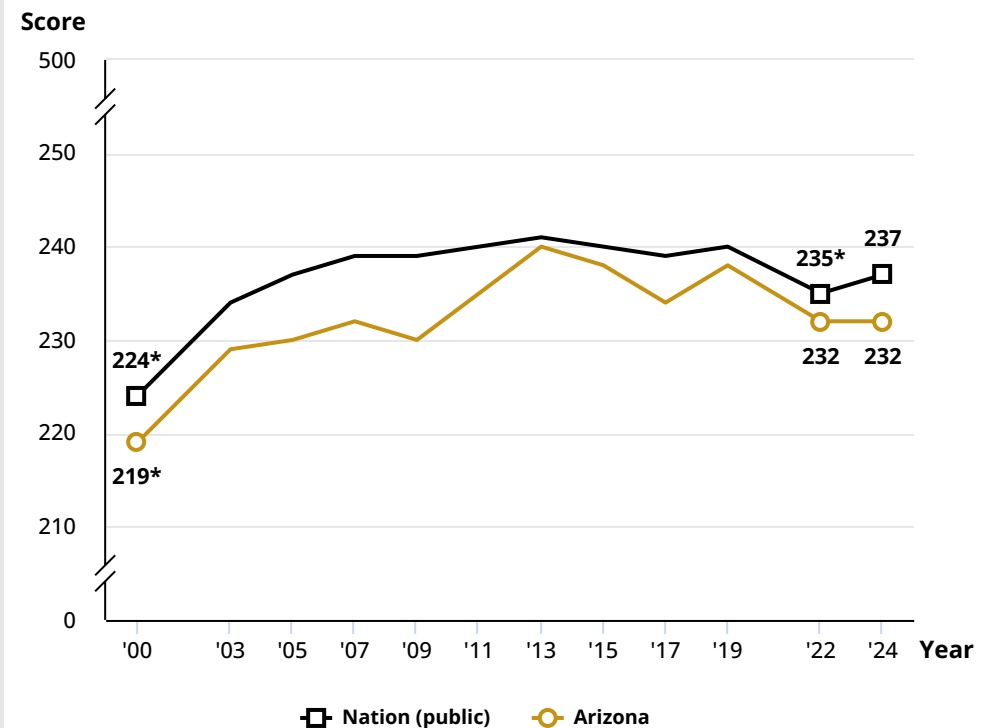


In 2024, the average score in Arizona (232) was

- lower than those in 31 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 18 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (22 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (26 points).
- In 2024, male students in Arizona had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (26 points).
