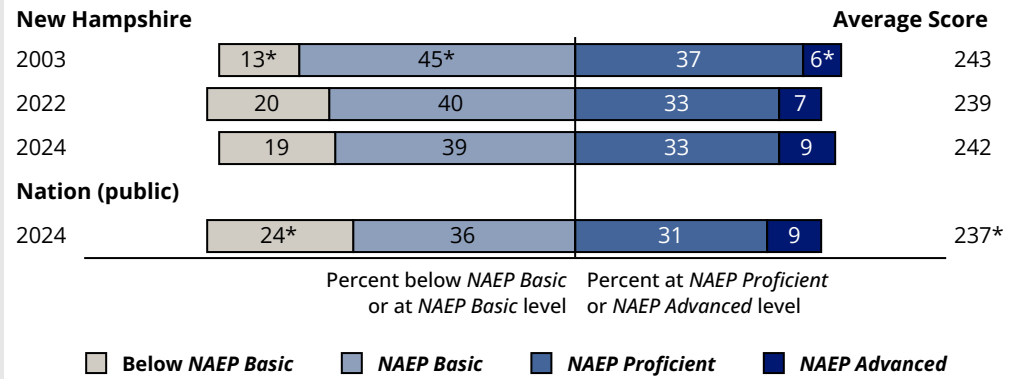


OVERALL RESULTS

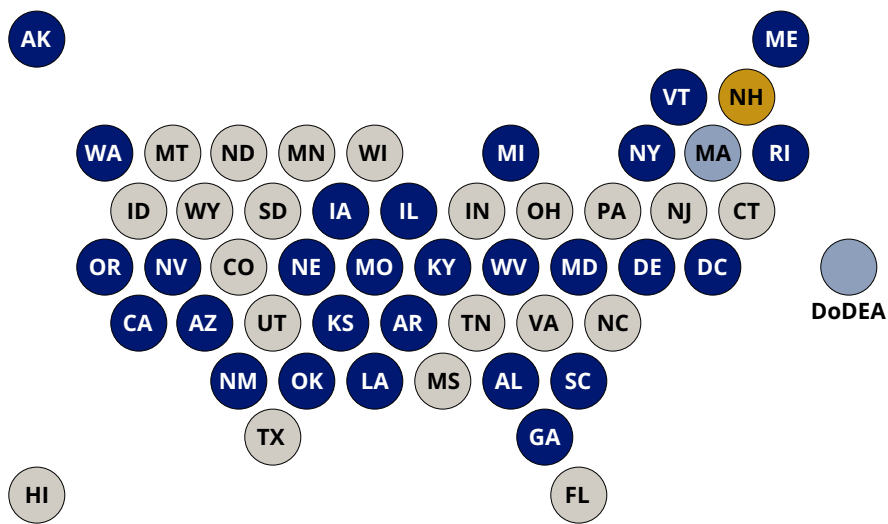
- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in New Hampshire was 242. This was higher than the average score of 237 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Hampshire in 2024 (242) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (239) and in 2003 (243).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 43 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (40 percent) and in 2003 (43 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Hampshire who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 81 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (80 percent) and was smaller than that in 2003 (87 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

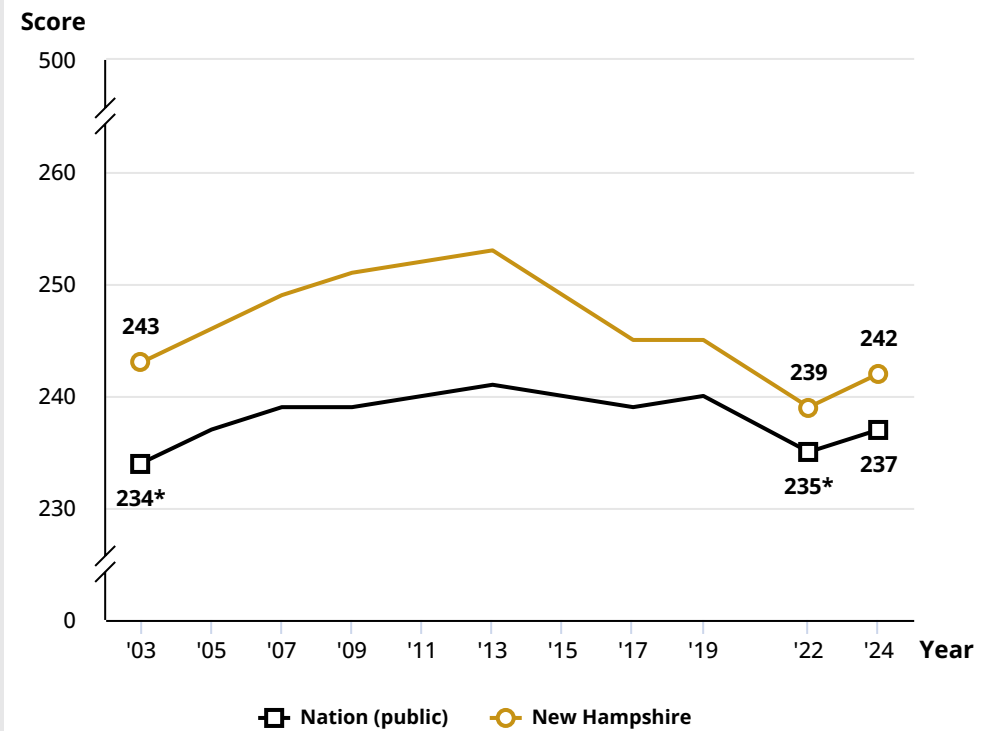
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2024, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (19 points).
- In 2024, male students in New Hampshire had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 7 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (18 points).
