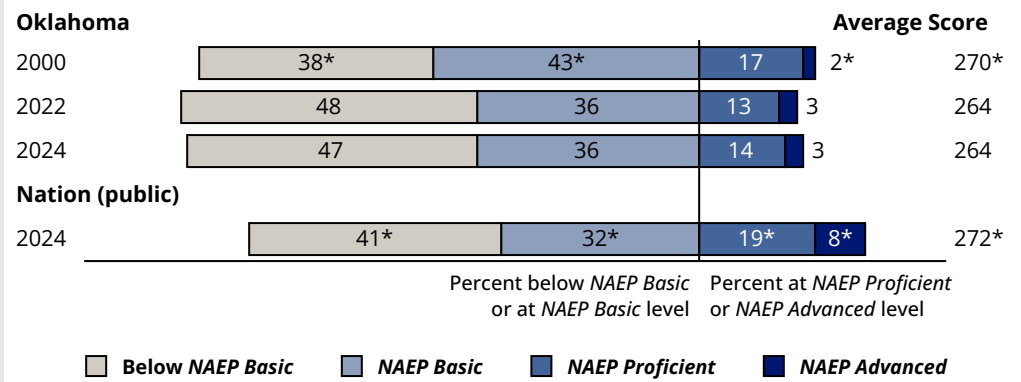


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Oklahoma was 264. This was lower than the average score of 272 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Oklahoma in 2024 (264) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (264) and was lower than their average score in 2000 (270).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 17 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (16 percent) and in 2000 (18 percent).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 53 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (52 percent) and was smaller than that in 2000 (62 percent).

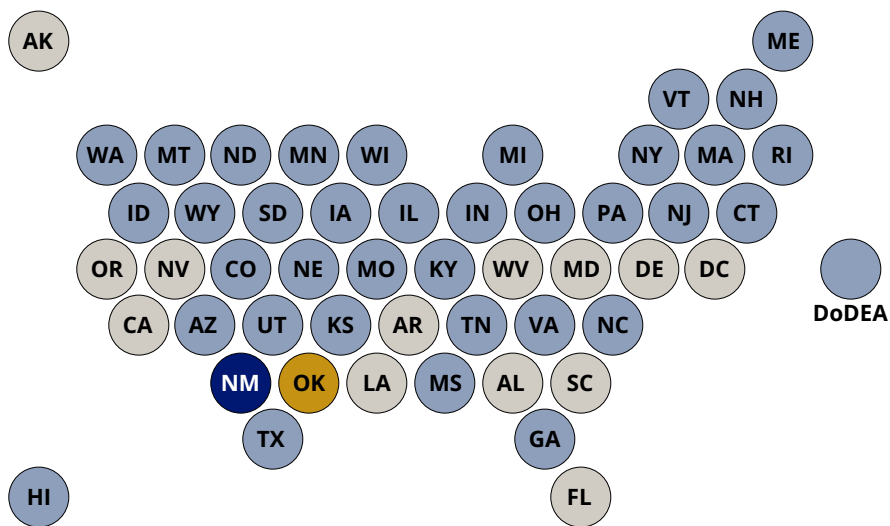
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

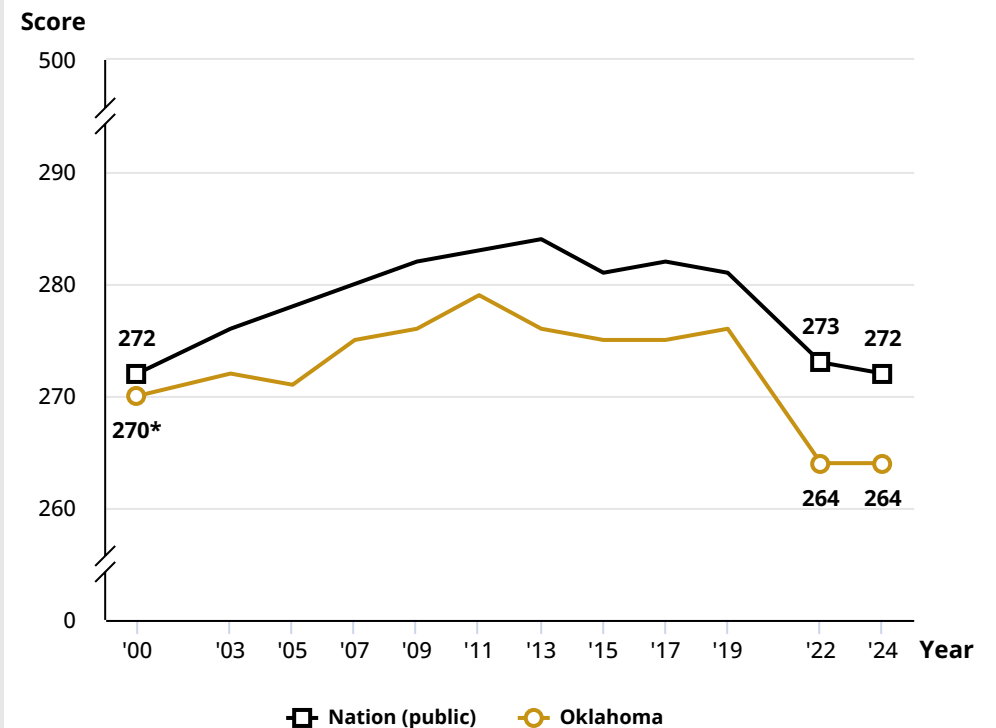


In 2024, the average score in Oklahoma (264) was

- lower than those in 37 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 1 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 13 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (29 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (14 points).
- In 2024, male students in Oklahoma had an average score that was higher than that for female students by 5 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (19 points).
