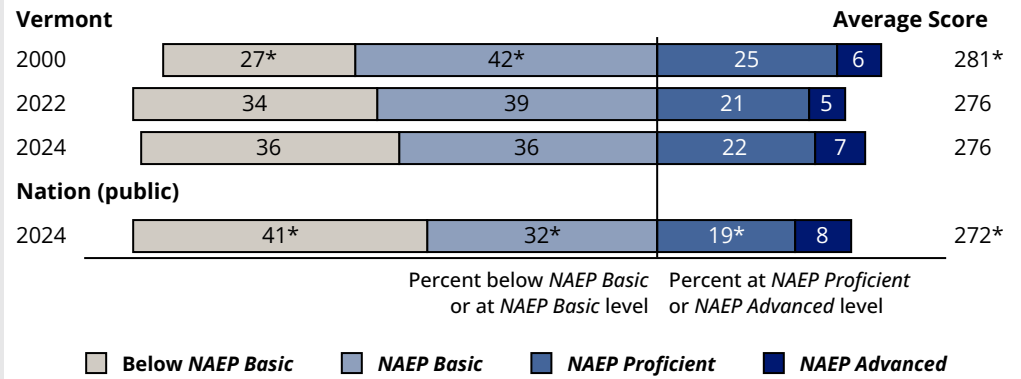


OVERALL RESULTS

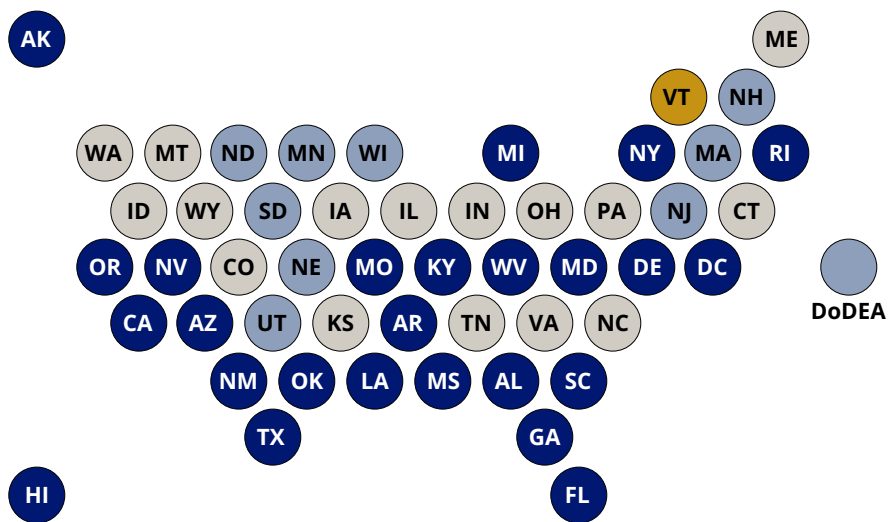
- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Vermont was 276. This was higher than the average score of 272 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Vermont in 2024 (276) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (276) and was lower than their average score in 2000 (281).
- The percentage of students in Vermont who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (27 percent) and in 2000 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Vermont who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 64 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (66 percent) and was smaller than that in 2000 (73 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

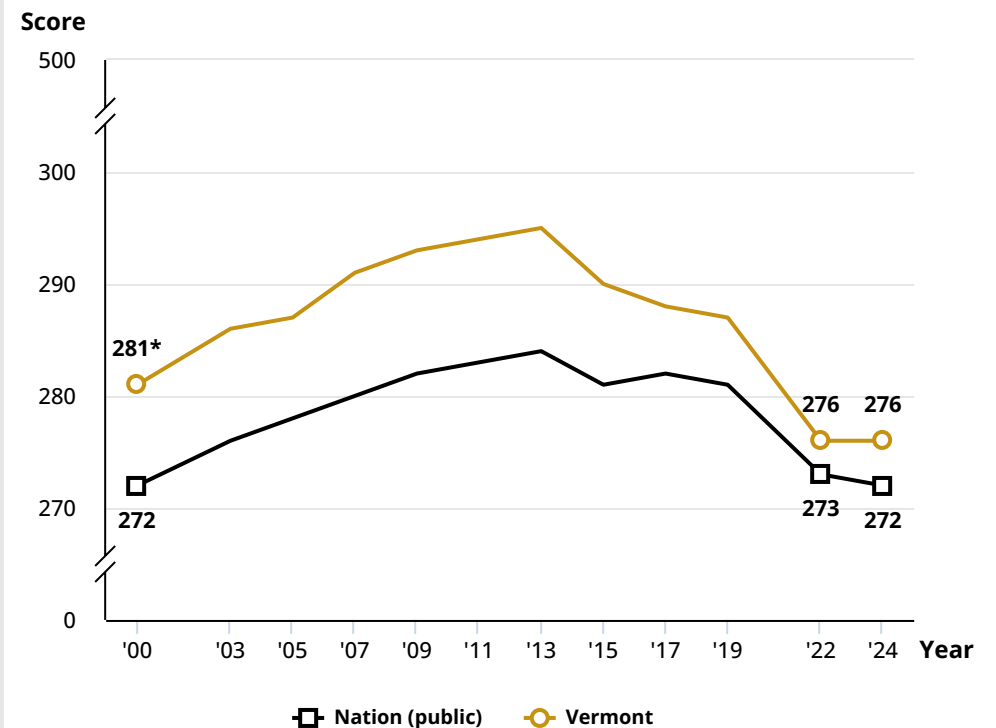
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS



In 2024, the average score in Vermont (276) was
■ lower than those in 10 states/jurisdictions
■ higher than those in 25 states/jurisdictions
■ not significantly different from those in 16 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2024, because reporting standards were not met.
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2024, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, male students in Vermont had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (25 points).
