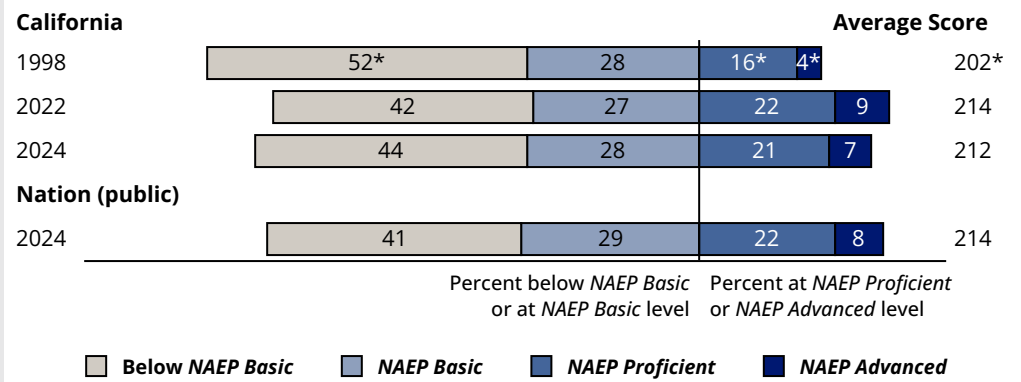


OVERALL RESULTS

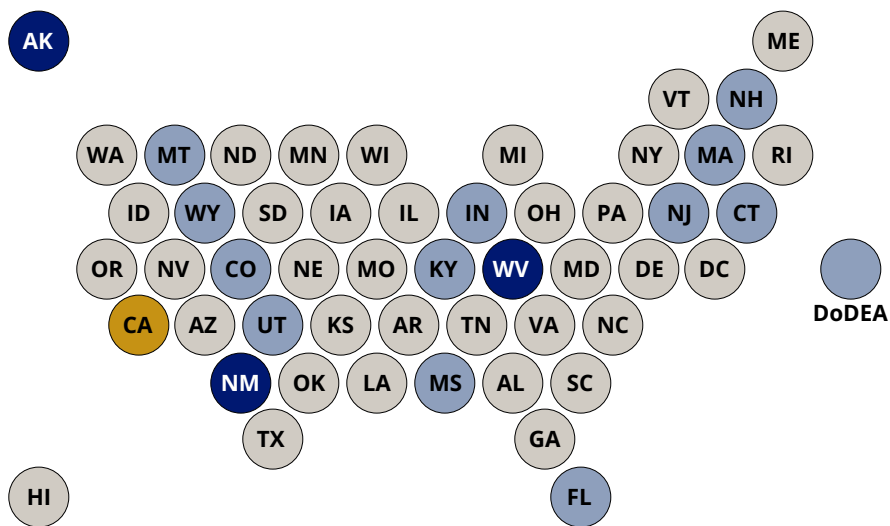
- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in California was 212. This was not significantly different from the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in California in 2024 (212) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (214) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (202).
- The percentage of students in California who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (31 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in California who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 56 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (58 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (48 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

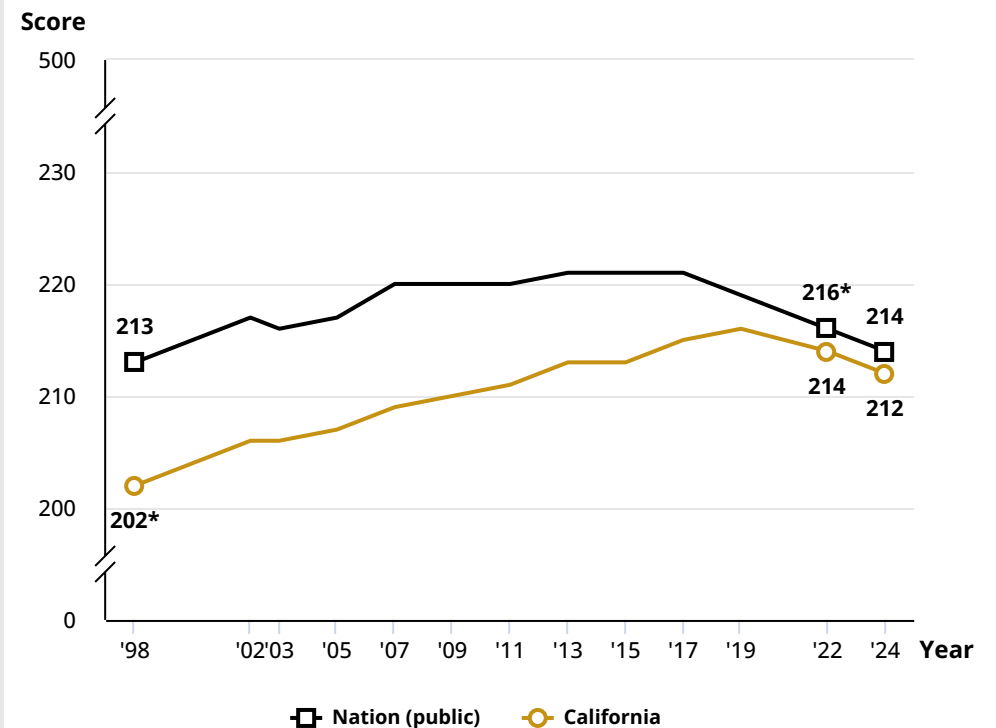
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 40 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (31 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (35 points).
- In 2024, male students in California had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 6 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (36 points).
