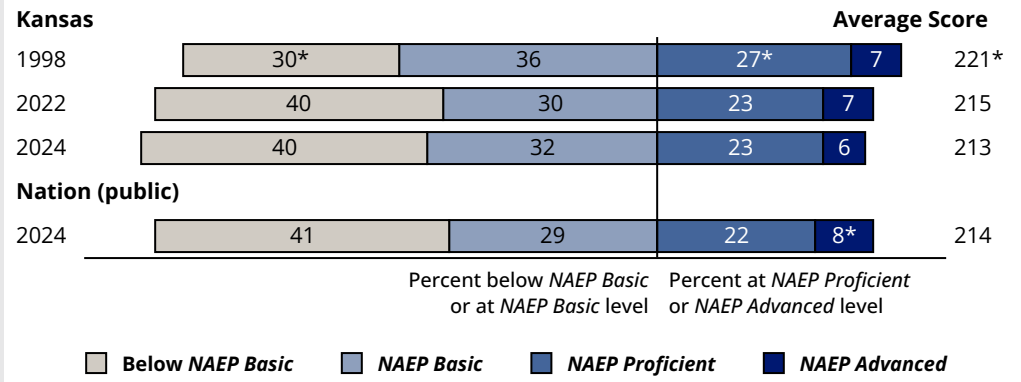


OVERALL RESULTS

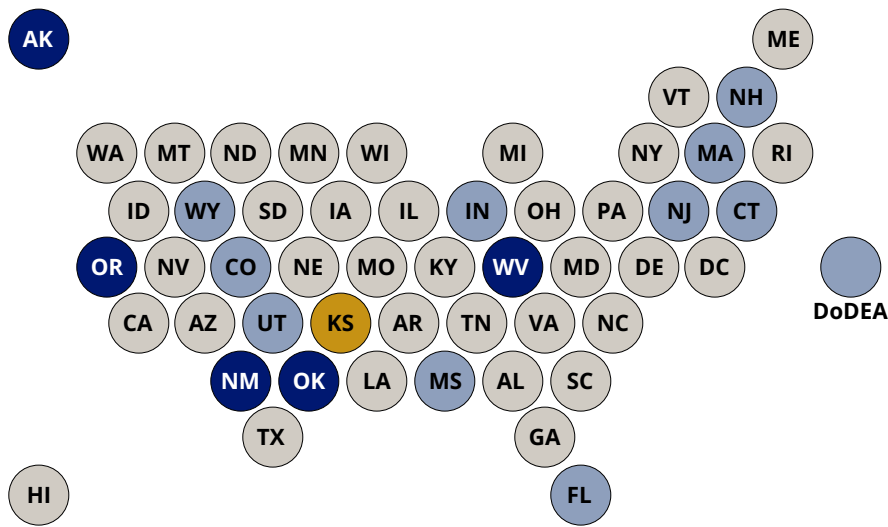
- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Kansas was 213. This was not significantly different from the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Kansas in 2024 (213) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (215) and was lower than their average score in 1998 (221).
- The percentage of students in Kansas who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 28 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (31 percent) and in 1998 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Kansas who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 60 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (60 percent) and was smaller than that in 1998 (70 percent).

NOTE: NAEP achievement levels are to be used on a trial basis and should be interpreted and used with caution. Detail may not sum to totals because of rounding.

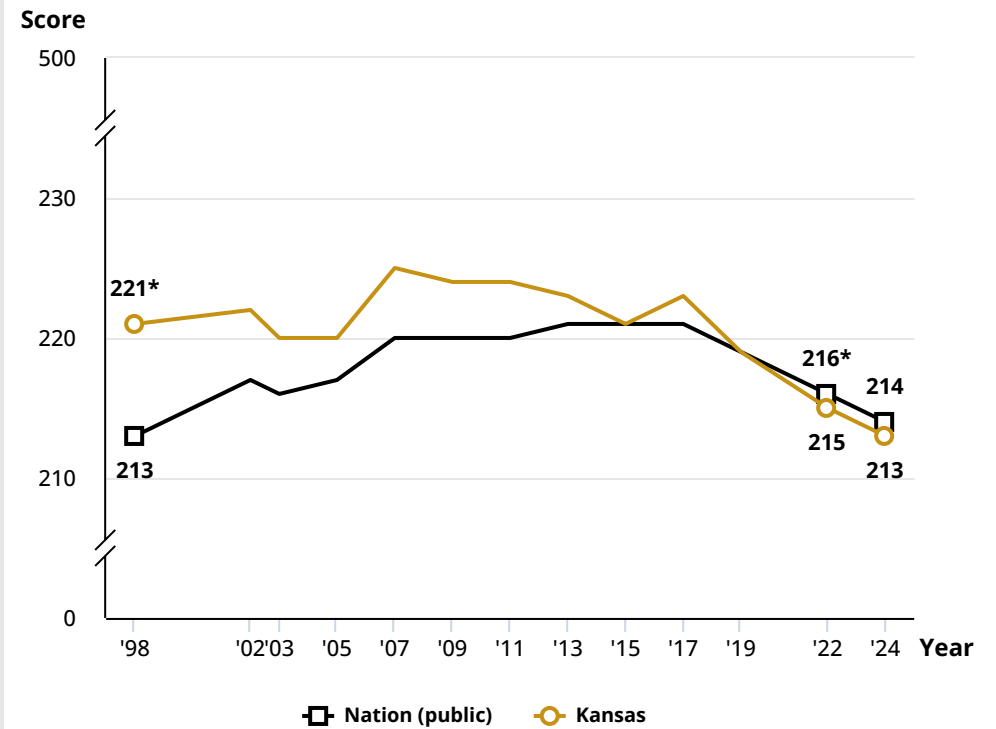
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (30 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
- In 2024, male students in Kansas had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (23 points).
