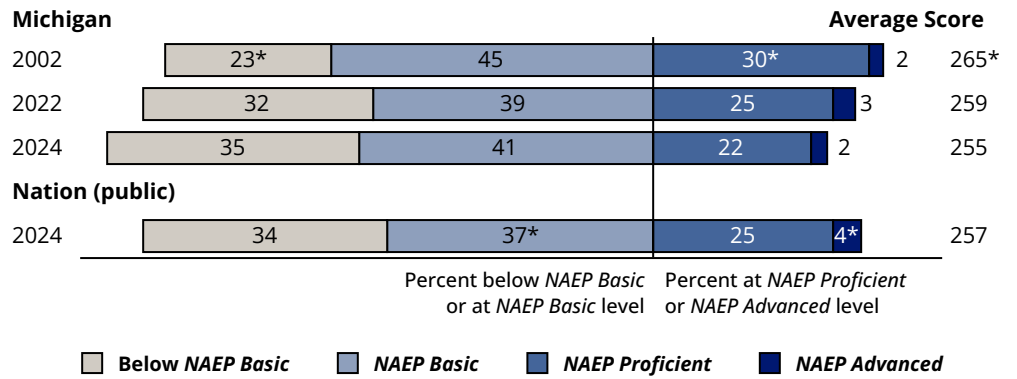


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Michigan was 255. This was not significantly different from the average score of 257 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2024 (255) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (259) and was lower than their average score in 2002 (265).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 24 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (28 percent) and was smaller than that in 2002 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 65 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (68 percent) and was smaller than that in 2002 (77 percent).

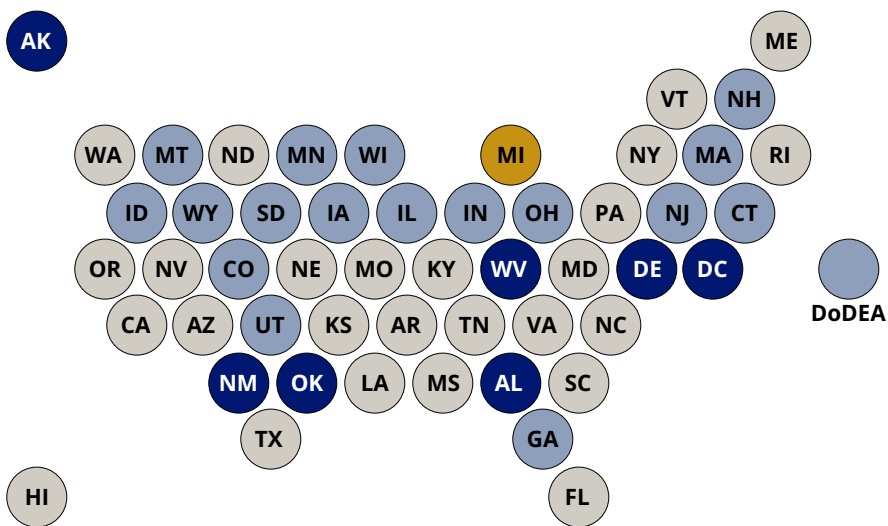
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

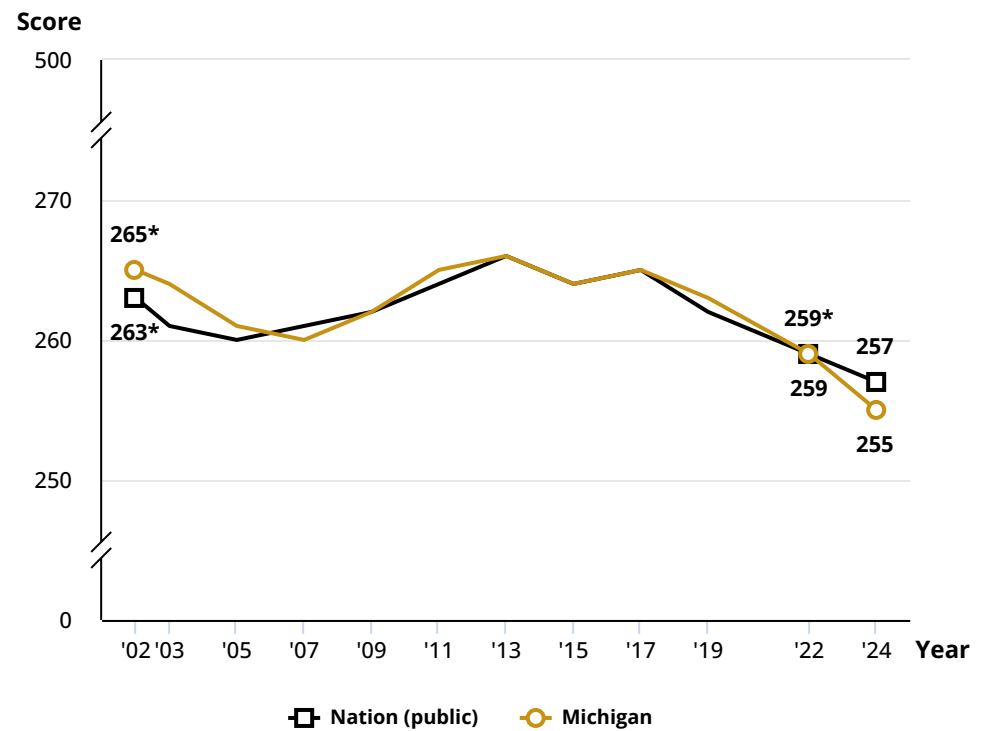


In 2024, the average score in Michigan (255) was

- lower than those in 18 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 7 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 26 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (28 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 14 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, male students in Michigan had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 10 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (13 points).
