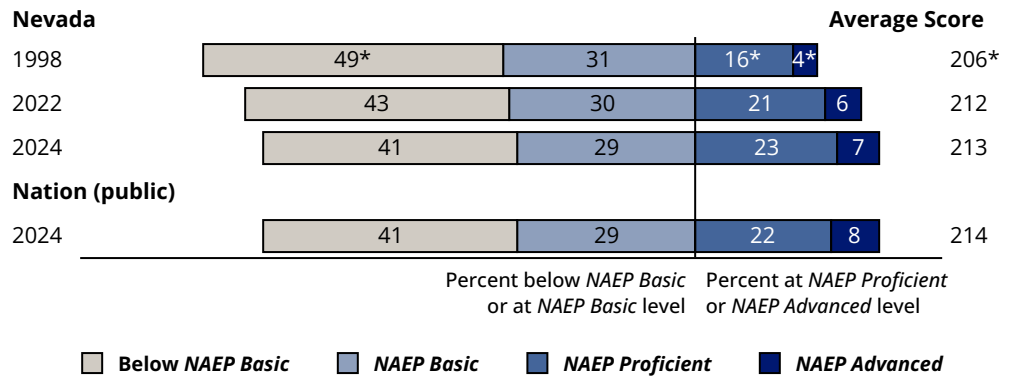


OVERALL RESULTS

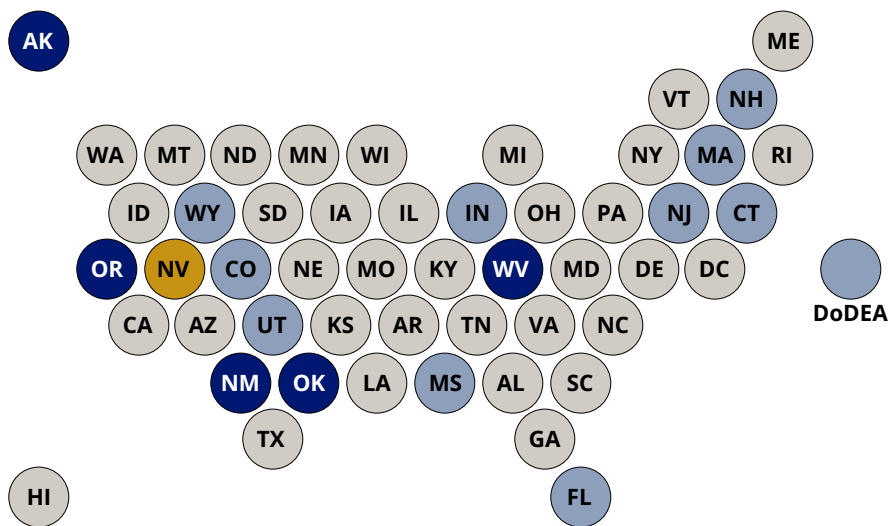
- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Nevada was 213. This was not significantly different from the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Nevada in 2024 (213) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (212) and was higher than their average score in 1998 (206).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 30 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (27 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 59 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (57 percent) and was greater than that in 1998 (51 percent).

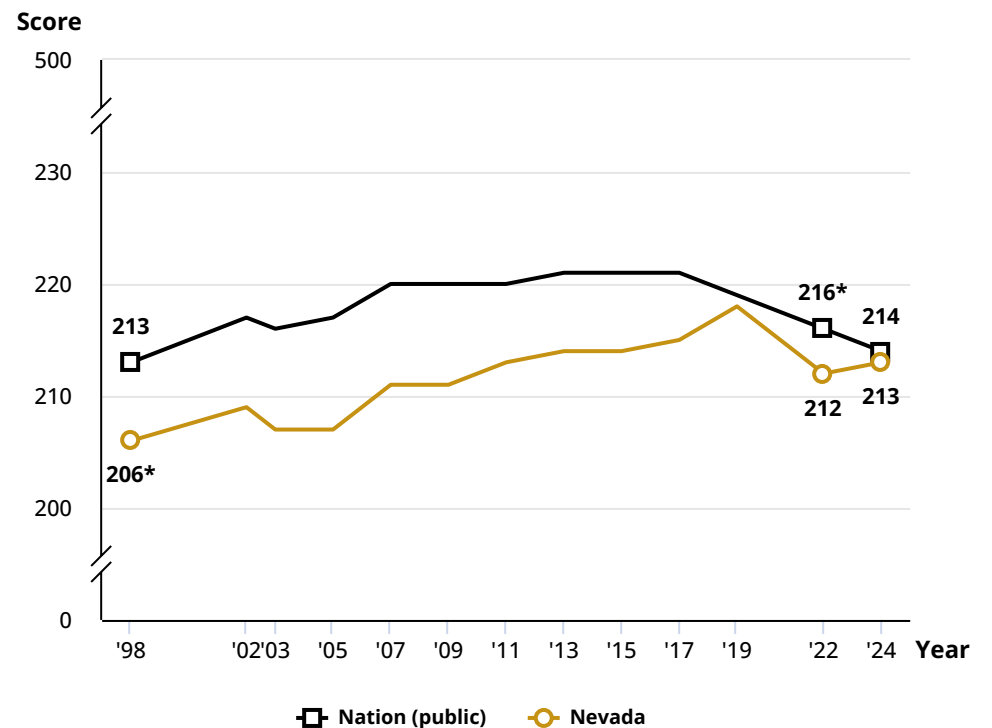
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS



In 2024, the average score in Nevada (213) was  
■ lower than those in 11 states/jurisdictions  
■ higher than those in 5 states/jurisdictions  
■ not significantly different from those in 35 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (30 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
- In 2024, male students in Nevada had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 9 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
