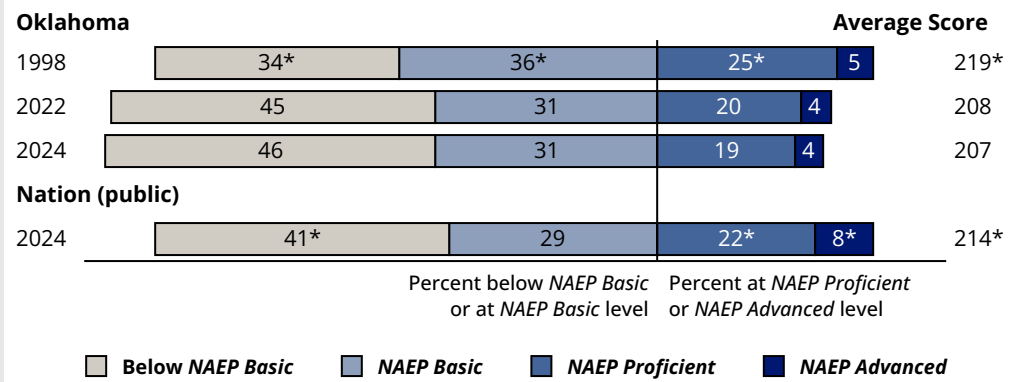


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in Oklahoma was 207. This was lower than the average score of 214 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Oklahoma in 2024 (207) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (208) and was lower than their average score in 1998 (219).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 23 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (24 percent) and was smaller than that in 1998 (30 percent).
- The percentage of students in Oklahoma who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 54 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (55 percent) and was smaller than that in 1998 (66 percent).

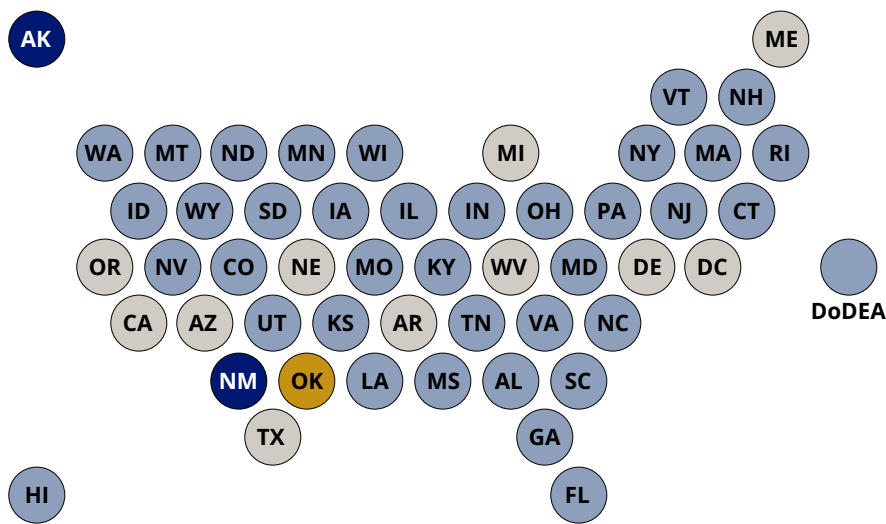
NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

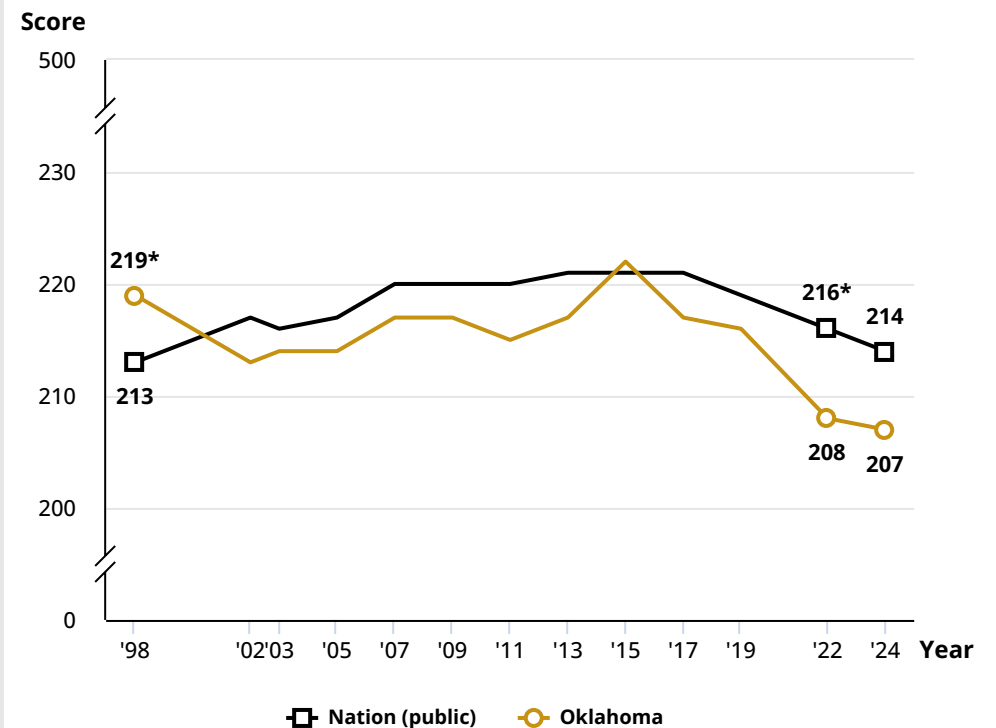


In 2024, the average score in Oklahoma (207) was

- lower than those in 38 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 11 states/jurisdictions

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (30 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (21 points).
- In 2024, male students in Oklahoma had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 8 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (23 points).
